CRIME IN OUR VILLAGE

Yet another burglary in the village and I suspect that most villagers simply regard this as just another unavoidable event.

This is not the case. Here are some simple truths.

- The police are not responsible for preventing crime. We are.
- All of these burglaries are avoidable if the village works as a team

I am security minded. Not obsessively but 30 years in law enforcement leaves a mark. When I first came to the village I was challenged three times in the first 30 minutes by residents. I really liked that. This was a community that was bothered. They were not intrusive, merely helpful, but at the same time clear that these were people who were going to stand up.

I fear we may have lost this spirit in our more transient and perhaps isolated society.

I have tracked, followed, arrested, interviewed, and convicted burglars and robbers of all types.

- They stand out. In our community they will be obvious
- They will always have a vehicle at the scene or nearby. Often with a driver remaining in the vehicle
- They will be furtive and observant and do unusual things

- They may call at several addresses
- They will not be plausible
- They are rarely organised
- They look for quick escape routes but are reckless

I was always amazed observing them how obviously suspicious they were even in towns and cities. When debriefing prolific burglars they look for little things. Cars on driveways, letter boxes (fishing rod entry, long story), dogs, alarms, lights on, TV on show,etc

They rarely remember exactly where they have 'screwed' but remembered roads and houses by entry points.

What don't they like.

- BEING CHALLENGED AND RECOGNISED
- SEEING PEOPLE WRITE REG NUMBERS DOWN
- BEWARE SIGNS
- DOGS
- SIGNS OF LIFE (RADIO ON, LIGHTS)

What can you do?

If you are walking your dog **BE BOTHERED TO LOOK**

If you are driving through the village **BE BOTHERED TO STOP LOOK AND NOTE**If you see something **TELL SOMEONE ELSE AT THE TIME NOT LATER**

At night always take car keys and computers upstairs with you.

IF WE CAN BE BOTHERED WE CAN BEAT THIS TOGETHER. START NOW.


COLLECTION IN MEMORY OF RONNIE




