VILLAGE HALL

Following our recent Village Hall meeting we all agreed that due to regular annual increases to our running costs (Insurance, Electricity, rent and rates), we have no choice but to increase our hire and rental charges. In addition we also have some large maintenance bills looming. Therefore in order to keep the Hall up to a high standard we must make these changes. In fact the last time the charges were raised was nearly 10 years ago. Therefore as from 1ST April, 2008 the new charges are as follows:

Hall Hire

Villagers rate rises from £5/hr to £7.50/hour Non villagers rate rises from £10 to £15/hour

Garage Rental

Rises from £2.50/week to £3.50/week

We hope that you appreciate that this is necessary and not beforetime.

In the meantime thank you for your valued custom and we hope that you continue to rent/hire the hall and garages.

In addition to financing the running costs we have, in the last 10 years successfully replaced the

floor, kitchen, decorated throughout, upgraded the heating, added secondary glazing and purchased 8 new tables. Our plans for the future include outside decoration and repairs, replacing and upgrading the porch and extensive roof repairs. We look forward to welcoming you to the Hall in the future.

SCHOOLDAYS AT WEST ILSLEY SCHOOL - Can you help with my researches?

This year The School at East IIsley is celebrating the Centenary of its buildings on the present site, (although the school dates from 1832). To mark the occasion, I am compiling a booklet on the history of education in The IIsleys. I wish to include the story of **West IIsley's school** which closed in 1966 when the two schools amalgamated.

At the moment I know very little about the history of West IIsley School, but I have made a partial list of head teachers, from old documents, going back to 1847. The school, which closed in 1966, was built in 1870. Where was the school before that? Can anyone help with information?

For some months now I have been collecting old school photographs of East IIsley, and other documents and memories of ex pupils, and would now like to extend my search to West IIsley. We are mounting a major exhibition to mark the Centenary in October.

There must be many West Ilsley residents who attended either West or East Ilsley School, before moving on to Compton, and I would like to make contact with them, and record their memories.

ILSLEY UNDER FIVES TODDLER GROUP Amanda Knight


Many thanks to everyone who joined us for a coffee during our session on 19 March and shopped at the Phoenix Cards and Julia's

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

This is a message for all NHW Co-ordinators with a warning about cold callers. The first concerns individuals who have been seen around the Thatcham area touting for roofing work then asking for inflated prices when the work is complete. A Vauxhall Movano registration no W367PLK is possibly involved. (URN 710 of 25.03.08).

The second warning is from Hampshire Constabulary about 'tree surgeons' that are currently operating in their County although there is no indication yet that they are in West Berkshire. They are cold calling on residential homes to offer gardening services but for the amount of money they charge the standard of service is very poor.

In order to protect yourself never agree to have work done by a cold caller. If you think the work needs doing always obtain two or three quotes. Use the Yellow Pages or ask your neighbours if they can recommend a company.
