NATURE NOTES

Hedgerow harvest

Despite the non-appearance of summer this year, autumn beckons and our hedgerows are loaded with berries, hips and other fruits. Their bold colours contrast beautifully with the changing colours of leaves. These and many other fruits help to keep some of our native birds going through the winter. We too can use some of this hedgerow harvest to warm the cockles of our collective hearts in the depths of winter by the time-honoured remedy of Sloe Gin.

Many different recipes exist for this, but most are based on three simple ingredients - sloes, sugar and

gin. Sloes are found in the hedgerows around West Ilsley and are the berry fruits of the blackthorn bush which is related to the domestic plum.

Sloe gin Ingredients: 225g (8oz) Sloes 125g (4oz) Sugar 375ml (13 fl oz) Gin

Procedure:

Rinse and prick each sloe about 10 times and place in a suitably-sized container. Add the sugar, cover or seal the container and mix the contents. Repeat the mixing stage every day for 10 days. Then add the gin and stir the contents. Leave for a month or two until a deep red colour is achieved. Remove the sloes by straining and allow the sloe gin to mature for at least another month in a stoppered bottle.

BEST KEPT VILLAGE COMPETITION

This year West Ilsley scored 80 marks out of a possible 120 (66.7%), placing us 7th in the 'Small Village' category. This is unfortunately the same position as last year – but at least we are consistent! Stockcross was first with 81.8%.

The Judges comments are reported below (without any editing):

- The churchyard was generally well kept and cared for especially areas of old graves.
- Village Hall building looked very good but there was litter at the side and back including a long dead rabbit opposite the fire exit and discarded furniture at the rear
- The War Memorial appears to need some maintenance, cement patching cracked and crumbling and many inscriptions difficult to read and also some litter
- Playing fields excellent and well maintained. The Pavillion looked very good and well used, a pity so much litter had been left on the ground in front, also beer canister store area would be improved if screened.
- Pub was bright, welcoming, and clearly popular, clean and safe outside.
- The village was well kept, clean and tidy and enhance by the features judged
- In general the aims of the competition appear to have been met. Some of the features could have been improved by simple good housekeeping measures.

A pretty good report all round and perhaps the most important comment made by the judges was that they considered the village to be well kept, clean and tidy.
