#### September's Farming News

This month has been a fabulous time for us on the farm to finish planting the Winter Oilseed Rape and start the planting of Winter Wheat and Winter Barley. Thursday night and Friday's rainfall were perfectly timed to help the germination of all seeds as the seed beds had been very dry until then. This week we have a field of barley and three fields of wheat to finish the autumn planting which is very much the same time as in previous years. The beef cattle are still in the field enjoying the autumn sunshine and will soon be coming in to the sheds as the evenings draw in and become cooler and, therefore, the grass growth reduces. We will soon be picking out some of the fatter/finished animals to go to market. Twelve newly weaned beef animals were bought from Thame Market on Friday which is the start of the 2015 herd intake.

The sheep are all looking extremely well outside and the teasers have been introduced to the ewes for a few days pre-tupping next week. Ewe lambs have started to be bought from the North of England setting up the replacements for next season

Let us hope that this lovely weather continues for a while. Peter Carlisle

THE FACTS:Of the 150,000 sudden cardiac arrests that occur in the UK, more than 75,000 might have been saved if a defibrillator had been available in the first few minutes. For the best chance of survival, a shock to the heart should be delivered within the first 5 minutes. The likelihood successful resuscitation decreases approximately 10% with every minute that passes. After 10 minutes without defibrillation, few attempts at resuscitation are successful. Sadly, the average response time for emergency medical services in a typical community is 9 minutes and in West Ilsley this could easily be longer. That is why we would like our village to have its own defibrillator and all have immediate access to this potentially lifesaving equipment. #### SUPERFAST BROADBAND - UPDATE

By now you should have seen the new Green BT cabinet opposite the Old Chapel; this is our new Fibre Broadband cabinet. This will shortly be commissioned so that we can elect to upgrade our current Broadband packages, to take advantage of the increased speeds which will be available.

#### What is it?

The broadband connection will be travelling over Optical Fibre from Didcot (using cable-runs from East Ilsley), meaning the speed to each house can increase from around 3Mbps (Mega-bits per second) to around, if not better, than 20Mbps. This will make a significant difference to households with more than one person using the internet at a time, or video streaming.

#### When is it coming?

Soon. We're not precisely sure but before the end of the year. We'll let everybody know as we hear more

#### What will I need to do?

Nothing yet, but as soon as its available you'll need to contact your Broadband provider, and negotiate transferring your contract to a Fibre package, this will probably be more expensive. If you chose not to change your contract, your speeds will remain the same. They will probably arrange for an Engineer to come and visit to connect in a new Fibre modem and to test the line.

For example Plusnet, will charge £12.49 for standard unlimited broadband, but £17.49 for unlimited fibre.

#### Does the connection to my house change?

No. Your Broadband connection will still come over the old copper phoneline into your "Master Socket"; however BT may need to come round to change your master socket.

# What should I be doing now? Know where your Master Socket is.

This should be the point where the telephone line comes into your house, and there should be a square box which will have a horizontal split; it's called an NTE5 socket; if you still have an old fashioned round or oval socket, you may need to get a new socket fitted. Hopefully this will all be covered when the engineer is sent round.

#### What are microfilters?

A microfilter is a device that allows broadband to work at the same time as your telephone service. Without microfilters you may get problems with your broadband or experience noise on your telephone line.

Dependent of the type of Master Socket you may or may not need to plug microfilters into every used socket in your house. Speak to the engineer when they come round.

#### Where to place your Modem/Router

Your Modem/Router needs to be plugged in directly to the Master Socket, i.e. as close to where your line comes into the house. If it's plugged into an extension, it's probable that you will experience significantly reduced speeds.

#### Wired vs Wireless

Wired means that your devices connect to the modem with an "Ethernet Cable", and is always the most efficient. Nowadays people mostly connect with wireless. If your wireless signal does not reach your entire house, you can purchase a "Wireless Booster" or get a set of "Powerline Adapters".



#### NATURE NOTES

23<sup>rd</sup> September

Today is the autumn equinox marking the end of summer and the start of autumn.

The house martins have gone, I don't know when they left? You just become aware that they are no longer here. So different from the spring when the date of the arrival of the first birds is noted. It seems like only yesterday that a nest on the front of the house contained a late brood of nestlings demanding food, but I see from my notes that they flew the nest on the 28th of August. That gave them three to four weeks to grow strong before they set off on their first migration south, which will take them to Africa,

Autumn is also fungus time. In our few remaining meadows fairy rings may appear at this period of the year, often created by the champignon fungi. A single spore will settle in the grass and a toadstool appear, it's spores will spread outwards in a ring. The ground inside the ring becomes devoid of nutrients for the fungus so it keeps moving outward, the ring increasing in diameter. Although this ground inside the ring no longer meets the needs of the fungus the grass is enriched with it's decayed remains and a dark verdant grass grows It used to be believed (and perhaps still is by some) that these rings were where the fairies danced.

#### Dear the residents of West Ilsley,

I just wanted to say a huge "Thank-you" on behalf of myself and Great Ormond Street Hospital for your very generous donations towards my walk I did for them last month.

The walk itself was a fantastic success. Every day we were up at 6:00, packed up and left by 7:30. We'd then walk for more than 16 hours a day and pitch up the tents as it was getting dark. We covered up to 34Km a day and the only injury to report of was my friend's feet: he was taken to minor injuries after we finished and had 16 dressings on his feet. Other than the occasional wasp sting, cuts and blisters, the rest of us finished fine.

Even though money is still coming in we have surpassed £2,100, more than four times our original aim.

Another thank-you and special appreciation from myself and Charlie, Tom and Henry who did it with me and from Dr. Mike Burch the lead cardiologist at GOSH.

#### A34/M4 Junction 13: Roundabout Resurfacing Work

I am writing to inform you that the Highways Agency will be resurfacing the roundabout at the A34/M4 (Junction 13) Interchange at Chieveley, West Berkshire, to ensure the roundabout remains in a safe and serviceable condition.

For the safety of the workforce and our customers and to keep overall disruption to a minimum, work will be carried out at night between 10pm to 6am on the following dates, whilst fully closing either the east or west sides of the roundabout:

| Closure            | Dates*  |
|--------------------|---|
| West-side closures | Monday 6, Tuesday 7 and Monday 13 October     |
| East-side closures | Wednesday 8, Thursday 9 and Friday 10 October |

#### East-side Closures

During these closures the following slip roads/links will be closed:

- M4 Junction 13 westbound exit slip road
- M4 Junction 13 eastbound entry slip road
- A34 southbound approach to roundabout
- · A34 southbound departure from the roundabout

Road users will only be able to approach the roundabout from the A34 northbound link to access the M4 westbound carriageway, Moto Service Area and A34 slip road to Chieveley village; and M4 eastbound exit slip road to access the A34 northbound carriageway and slip road to Chieveley village.

West-side Closures

During these closures the following slip roads/links will be closed:

- · M4 Junction 13 eastbound exit slip road
- . M4 Junction 13 westbound entry slip road
- · A34 northbound approach to roundabout
- A34 northbound departure from the roundabout

Road users will only be able to access the roundabout from the A34 southbound slip road to access the M4 eastbound carriageway, Moto Service Area and A34 southbound link road; and M4 westbound exit slip road to access the A34 southbound carriageway and Moto Service Area.

#### **Diversion Routes**

During the closures clearly signed diversion routes will be in place for both motorway permitted and non-motorway traffic – the main diversion route will primarily use the A4.

Advance warning of the confirmed closure dates will be displayed on electronic and hard-standing black and yellow signs at the junction.
