ILSLEYS SCHOOL

Welcome back to school!

After a long and sunny summer break, the children have returned refreshed and ready to learn in their new classes. It has been great to see them in their new uniforms and see how excited they have been to get back to school and see their friends. In recent news, we created a display for the education tent at Royal County of Berkshire Show. We hope that you were able to find it and have a good look at all the children's hard work!

This term, children in Atlantic Class (Year 4/5/6) will be learning everything there is to know about Harry Potter. They will use Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone in their Literacy lessons and design potions, wands and interesting magical sweets in their Topic lessons. We may even be lucky enough to have a Hogwarts' Day where the children can dress up as their favourite character.

In Pacific Class, for Year 2, 3 and 4, children will be learning about the Stone Age. They will start by putting them into historical context by working on time lines of the UK and then the wider world. They will investigate how Stone Age people lived and hunted and create their own cave, complete with paintings. They will also be finding out about some of the animals that lived in that era. Their trip to Chiltern Open Air Museum will offer the children a great opportunity to experience living like Stone and Iron Age people.

Children in Arctic Class (Year R/1) will be learning all about themselves for their first topic. They will get to get to know each other better and think carefully about themselves, their abilities and their place in the world. They will be finding out about the human body and how it works, comparing themselves to other animals. They will be exploring all their senses and how they use them, finding out about where they live and thinking about their roles in the different groups they belong to – family, school, community. They will also talk about being independent, keeping healthy and the effects of exercise. They have begun by making a Time Capsule, which they will look at again at the end of the year to compare.

In other exciting news, we have managed to secure Arsenal Women's FC coaching again this year for all pupils in Year 2,3,4,5 and 6. This will take place in November, January and March this year. The children absolutely loved it last year and we are delighted to have been selected to take part again this year.

We have also secured weekly teaching of a highlyskilled gymnastics coach to teach one class a week, in addition to the dance teaching we already offer and games skills lessons with outside coaches.

Children in Year 3 and 4 will have the opportunity to learn the double bass this year which they are all

very excited about. They had their first lesson earlier this week and they couldn't believe the size of the instrument they were going to be allowed to play! In addition to this, we work with Berkshire Maestros so that children can take private lessons in guitar. We are also offering the following clubs in school:

- Press Crew Club school newspaper
- Art Club
- Games Skills Club
- Football Club
- Choir
- Recorders Club

Finally, we would like to share with you the fantastic results our pupils in Year 6 achieved in their end of Key Stage Two National Curriculum Tests. Every child in our cohort passed all of their tests! This prepares them incredibly well for life at secondary school and we couldn't be prouder of how hard they all worked.

There is lots more coming up over the next few months at The IIsleys including our annual Christmas Bazaar and our legendary Nativity production, so please do keep your eyes peeled for those dates!

VICTIMS FIRST

Care | Empower | Recover

Have you been a victim of crime or abuse?

Being a victim or a witness of a crime can be an emotional and difficult time.

Victims First provides free emotional and practical support to all victims and witnesses of crime or abuse, as well as family members of victims. It is available across Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire and can provide help regardless of whether or not the crime has been reported to the police.

A Victims First Officer can discuss any emotional or practical needs you may have and work with you to put a tailored support plan in place. This could involve referring you to a specialist service such as services for victims of sexual violence and domestic abuse.

The type of assistance available includes telephone and face to face support, advocacy including help to access other services such as sexual health clinics, drug and alcohol services and legal services, support through the criminal justice system (if you have reported the crime to the police) and therapeutic counselling. A Young Victims Service is also available to anyone under 18 and works with young people to help them cope with the effects of crime.
