#### **Annual Parochial Church Meeting**

The annual meeting was held in church on 20th April, at which a report on the various aspects of the church for 2008 was given. At the meeting, Alexandra Axtell was elected, together with lan Fewtrell-Smith, as church warden for the coming year. It was good to have had Graham and Kate Stacey join the benefice as curates during the vear and since then to have enjoyed their distinct style in the services they have been taking. Part of the meeting discussed the church finances, illustrated bγ а leaflet giving representations of income and outgoings. This shows clearly a deficit of £2,020 (about 21%) of income over expenditure, an untenable situation that we feel would be of concern to the whole village. 
## NEW ARRIVAL
