# EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON TUESDAY 18 H MAY

### Matters Arising

The water leak in Barrel Court footpath had been repaired by Thames Water. Village Post Boxes - The royal Mail have decided to leave both boxes where they are for the time being. Street Cleansing - West Berks have stated that there is a regular cleaning schedule for West Ilsley and have forwarded details. They should be informed of any particular problems. Notice board outside the Church – Alec Cole is in the process of carrying out the repair.

#### Correspondence received

A letter from a parishioner had been received expressing concern over the condition of the road and the road markings at the bottom of Blakes Hill near the Old Post Office. Clerk to write to Highways Dept requesting that the area be looked at. A lengthy discussion followed regarding the dangerous layout at the exit junction of the A.34, the horse crossing and speeding in the village. Clerk to pursue the procedure for training re: the use of S.I.D. (Speed Indicator Device).

#### Request for funding from W.I. Cricket Club.

A donation of £200 was required to restore the fence along the northern boundary of the recreation ground. As this was considered a matter of some urgency, the Parish Council agreed to review their reserve funds and if appropriate unanimously agreed that the request be met. Clerk to look at expected outgoings for the coming year.

<u>Planning Applications 04/01088/House Hillside</u> House, Folly Lane Single story outbuilding No objections.

<u>Dates of meetings for the coming year</u> July 12<sup>th</sup>, September 13<sup>th</sup>, November 8<sup>th</sup> (Consideration of Grants), January 10<sup>th</sup> (Setting of Precept), March 14<sup>th</sup>, May 9<sup>th</sup> (Annual Assembly).

#### Open Forum

From the floor concern was expressed that West Berks Planning Department was not necessarily informing all relevant households of planning applications. A discussion took place reference the Manor Farm planning application, with views both for and against the widening and re-siting of the entrance. The Chairman reiterated that if any parishioner had concerns over planning issues, the Parish Council would be willing to hear their concerns, however the Parish Council does have a duty to reflect the views of the whole village. From the floor a request was made for Dog Bins to be placed in central dog walking areas. Clerk to investigate costs etc. The Chairman reported that Geoffrey Pike of the West Berks Legal team had contacted him. A meeting is planned in the near future to move forward the dispute between the Village Hall Committee and the Charity Commission. The Chairman would be keen to hear from anyone who would be interested in filling the two vacant positions on the Parish Council. If any member of the village has the necessary skills to carry out a basic internal audit of the Parish Council's accounts, please contact the Chairman or the Clerk (200242).

# EXTRACTS FROM THE REPORT OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY HELD ON TUESDAY 18<sup>TH</sup> MAY 2004

Chairman's Annual Report The Chairman thanked Nick Carter and his colleagues from W.B.C. for running the Parish for the 16 months prior to the formation of the current council. During the past year the problem of flooding in the village has been much improved and the water leak beneath Barrel Court footpath repaired. The year also saw the formal naming of Main Street. A criteria and formal procedure is now in place for local organisations

wishing to apply for a grant. Applications should be submitted by November 1<sup>st</sup>. The Parish Council would like to hear from any parishioners who may have any ideas, issues or suggestions that they would like to be considered.

West IIsley Church The Church continues to hold three services per month, ranging from family services to Holy Communion and After School and Pram Services. The All Age Worship Planning Group has been re-established. The church remains unlocked during the day for the benefit of all. Audrey Tizzard has taken over the role of 'unlocker' from the Sugden There have been two weddings and two baptisms during the past year. We were delighted when Denise Brown was ordained priest in September. She continues her full involvement in West IIsley Church. The churchyard continues to be enjoyed by many and we thank Norman Carlisle and Richard Gore for helping to keep the churchyard tidy. The PCC launched a 'Raising the Roof' campaign with the intention of raising £45.000 by December 2005. The village is and has been busy with many fund raising events, this year the PCC will again organise the pre-show dance. A significant change is coming in 2004 with the retirement of Rev. Antonia Cretney. At this point we do not know whether the benefice will remain in its present format of if we will join with another. We continue to work hard to offer the best we can to the village and look forward with hope to the rest of 2004 and the years to come, with all the challenges that inevitably arise.

Downland Volunteer Group The Group would like to thank West IIsley for their continuing support over the years. The DVG provides an essential service in transporting the elderly and those in need to various medical appointments both locally and to Oxford and Reading. During the past year our drivers have made just under 1000 journeys. The DVG Handybus continues to be well used, in the mornings it is loaned to the Downland Practice for transport to and from the surgeries and in the afternoon for various trips including West IIsley Evergreens shopping trips to Wantage and Abingdon. We hope we can continue to count on the support of West Ilsley Parish Council in the future. As a Charity we cannot make a charge for journeys and can only ask for donations, which rarely cover the mileage allowance paid to drivers. Finally, we are always looking for volunteers and if anyone in West Ilsley could find the time to help us out, we should be very grateful.

West Ilsley News - The WIN has continued in much the same way as for the last year, both content and costs being fairly consistent. We receive the occasional feedback but assume that the general silence means that nobody has any major objection to what we are doing. This year Steve Price moved out of the village to Stanmore. We are both happy to continue the production and editing for another year. We will be putting in a bid for funding in the autumn as usual.

West IIsley Village Fete takes place in mid July. Last year the wonderful weather helped to make the day a great success. The fete, after costs, took £2147, all of which was handed as donations to local groups. (A list of donations is available). Thanks go to everyone involved for their help and support.

The IIsley's School No report.

Ilsley's Under 5 Playgroup A new committee took over in September 2003. This year activities have included visits to the Panto in Newbury and Legoland and the organising of Santa's Grotto at the Ilsley School. Thanks to the Parish Council for the donation to buy a Santa Suit! Our OFSTED report in November went well and the response was favourable. We have purchased a new cupboard, toys, bookcase and outdoor shed for storage. The Playgroup is not currently running at capacity, which affects our revenue, and at present our outgoings are more than our income. Added to this the school is planning to make a charge for our use of the hall from September. It is likely that some serious fund raising will be necessary in the future. In the coming year we will be running a cake stall at the Sheep Fair and the teas at the WI Fete and have other ideas for later in the year. **Downland Sports Centre** Another busy year! The children's activates continue to thrive. We provide activities during the school holidays, with a great team of casual staff. The pool was a great success with the centre having some 740 visits. This year the pool will open on 7<sup>th</sup> June and we have purchased new pool equipment and floats. Thank you to the Parish Council for their contribution. The Gym is fairly quiet but we

are installing new equipment in July and hope for

some increased usage.

Recreation and Social Association (Village Hall Committee) Our Committee consists of 3 officers, 4 residents and 6 user group representatives. Hall usage continues to increase and we now have some regular bookings. An objective for 2004 is to increase the usage. Fund raising continues with £2345 being raised in the last financial year. All monies will go to replenish funds following expenditure on maintenance and activities for the Village. Maintenance has included a replacement cupboard and new floor following a flood, the roof has been patched up and the outside gravel replenished. There will soon be new curtains (made by villagers). This year we will continue the Children's Activity Club and repeat the 'Camp Out' in tents in the woods. The income last year was £4705, expenditure £2082 and our bank balance was £10393, although there has been some expenditure since. Fundraising this year will include the usual firework evening. The Charity Commission continues to reject our proposals for separating the management of Village Hall and the Recreation Ground. The Parish Council has now employed the services of a solicitor and progress is being made, further meetings are planned with all interested parties being involved.

Ilsley Evergreens Our present membership is 41 of which 14 are from West Ilsley. The year began with our AGM in March. This year coach outings have included trips to Basingstoke, Guildford, Ringwood, Lymington, Cotswolds, Bristol, Bath and Milton Keynes for Christmas shopping. The annual bazaar in November was poorly attended but raised a respectful amount for our funds. A Christmas Lunch was enjoyed at the Swan, East Ilsley. We are grateful for donations from the West Ilsley Show and the East Ilsley Sheep Fair, which allow us to subsidise our activities. Our membership stays fairly constant but new members are always welcome.

W.I.Cricket Club There are currently 35 playing members and two teams. We are keen to attract a few

more players into the club and social members are always welcome. Family membership is £12 and individual £5. Junior coaching will be available this summer. The bar will again be open for the Fete for everyone's enjoyment. We have appealed to the Parish Council for a grant to fix the fence along the northern boundary. Hopefully the issue involving the Charity Commission will soon be resolved. A big thank you to the Carlisle family for all their help and support throughout the year.

Last year we revitalized the village tennis court having it professionally cleaned, repainted and with new perimeter fencing at the front. The Parish Council gave us a grant of £350 towards the total cost of £2455.75. I am glad to say there is no evidence of vandalism or damage to fencing by people climbing over. There is always a key at the vet's surgery or with the cricket club. We had a good year with 278 players of all ages and the fees taken of £557.50 were the highest for many years - though this in no part was due to the necessary increase in prices. We hope to maintain the fee of £2 for adults and £1 for children for the foreseeable future. Last year's improvements to the court depleted our funds almost totally but they now stand at £652.93. The total is banked in national savings. Our expenses have been the standard ones ie £50 to the cricket club for grass cutting and £25 for the booking clerk's honororium. Only £10 expenses on weed killer as this was covered in the professional cleaning in 2003.

We look forward to another good year, but I would repeat as I did last year that the present committee who have taken responsibility for the court for the last 15 years would like to have a rest. No-one yet has come forward to take over responsibility for the maintenance of the court and the booking and collection of fees from players. We hope that a group of people will come forward to take over. The principle of keeping the court an "open" one, run by an independent management committee, rather than a court controlled by a tennis club, is one that all past and present members of the management committee adhere to strongly; it is part of our charter of principles and as such should continue. The court then maintains its independent status, allowing all and everyone from West Ilsley and the surrounding villages to enjoy its facilities.

## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Thames Valley Police are warning homeowners to remember the security of their houses whilst still enjoying the benefits of warmer weather. This follows a number of burglaries at houses where the doors and windows were left open or unlocked.

Over a 6-month period up to March this year there were a high number of burglaries across Berkshire where the burglar was able to get in through an unlocked door or window. These burglaries are carried out by opportunist criminals. The following simple security advice can deter them:

- 1. Remember to close and lock all doors and windows when leaving your home.
- 2. At night ensure all ground floor windows are closed and locked, and if you live in a bungalow or ground floor flat use a lockable restrictor that leaves a gap of no more than 9 inches.
- 3. If you are older aged or have older aged relatives living alone, encourage them to keep their rear door locked to avoid being distracted at the front door by burglars who may be operating in pairs.

I have been asked to advise you that we are again receiving reports of burglaries where entry has been gained by placing a metal bar or piece of wood through the letterbox and forcing the internal door handle down. Please ensure that if you have this type of door that you double lock the door and remove the key. 30% of all burglaries have occurred through insecure doors and windows. Vehicle kevs in particular are being taken from properties and used to steal vehicles in the drive. Please keep all keys and We are also seeing an handbags out of sight. increase in thefts of Playstations, CDs and DVDs. Please mark these items with an indelible pen so that you would recognize them if they were stolen, or write on your postcode and house name or number by using a property marking pen. If you see anybody acting suspiciously, please contact the Police on 08458 505505 or Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. # SATURDAY ACTIVITY CLUB 19<sup>th</sup>/20<sup>th</sup> June 2004 CAMP OUT

Following another good afternoon of activities this May, the Village Hall Committee are pleased to announce that the next Activity Club will take place on Saturday June 19<sup>th</sup> and extend through to Sunday 20<sup>th</sup>.

It will be centred around camping, with an afternoon activity around the camp followed by a camp sleep over. Details as follows:

#### Part 1 – Saturday afternoon 2-5pm

Camp skills for under 5yr olds - including wood collection, nature hunt, den building plus games in the woods (children under 3 must be accompanied).

5yrs+ will prepare the campfire for cooking and enjoy an orienteering game to find the marshmallows for tea. To conclude the afternoon, hot dog tea and marshmallows for all cooked on the fire.

#### Part 2 - Saturday 5pm to Sunday 11am

Prepare the camp for the evening and night. Erect tents, play games and enjoy family BBQ supper in the evening (from 7pm). Cook breakfast, take down camp, clean and tidy up.

Part 1, all children over 3 can be left, but helpers welcome and needed.

Part 2, a responsible parent/adult/volunteer to accompany (on a ratio of no more than 1 adult to 4 kids), help out and sleep over from 5pm to 11am.

The campsite is located 1 mile outside West Ilsley. Take the Catmore road and follow the signs. Park inside the gate on the LHS.

All food and drink is included for Part 1. For Part 2 please bring your own supper. We shall have a BBQ fire going so we suggest you bring something to cook and your own refreshments. Juice and water will be available throughout plus milk, cereal, bacon and eggs for the morning. Please bring anything else you wish to eat or drink.

There is no charge this year, but we do require your signed booking form in advance. Without this we cannot accept the child/ren. The weekend will go ahead whatever the weather!!

To join in, wear appropriate old clothing that you don't mind getting dirty or torn. For Part 2, the following kit is required.
