#### UPDATE FROM THE PC

We had a busy AGM and many thanks for those who attended and for the Club representatives for preparing and delivering a summary report. A copy of the reports will be included within the meeting minutes, which will be uploaded onto the website in due course.

Parking – we have received a couple of complaints from residents about parked vehicles. Could we please remind everyone that vehicles should be parked on the road and not on the pavement and could we make sure that the bus stops are kept free to allow for users to stop the bus and to safely board it.

Recreation Ground Poo Bins – the bins are being used, which is great news, but only a few individuals are emptying them. As previously mentioned these are NOT emptied by the council and therefore we would appreciate it if those using the bins could empty them once in a while. Anyone emptying these bins should put the bag into one of the main bins (the nearest one is next to the pond/gazebo area) and replace with a new bin bag (spare bin bags are provided in the bottom of the bin).

We are all aware of the recent accident that damaged the Old Post Office as well as one of the planters outside of the Old Chapel and the newly planted hedge and lucky that no one was seriously hurt. We are going to write to WBC to express our dismay that yet another accident has happened whilst no action is taken to try and address the situation. Liz Dray is leading this (see below) so if you have any specific concerns please contact Liz.

#### SID DEVICE

You may have noticed the arrival of a new Speed device at the Eastern end of the village. This is called a mobile SID (Speed Indication Device) and we are grateful to Carolyne Culver for obtaining us matched funding to enable the Parish Council to purchase one for the village. We've had a few teething problems with battery issues but we are working on this; however, even if the screen display misbehaves the device continues to collect data in the background which is going to be useful to collect over time.

West Berkshire Council have strict rules regarding these devices and we are required to submit an application before we can use it in a specific location. This comes with additional requirements regarding street furniture to site the device on, specific safety distance requirements etc. At the moment I have 2 approved locations and the SID will next be sited on the pole by the recreation ground opposite the Harrow. Whilst we sort out battery issues I would be most grateful if you could let me know if you see the device not giving the full display and I will replace the battery.

If you feel that "Speed" is an issue in a specific part of the village please let me know and I'm happy to put in another application to the council. We only do this once and then retain the site approval for any future use. We have also purchased a Tripod for the device where there is no street furniture to use; this requires someone remaining nearby but this could be done for 1-2 hours at a time. Please get in touch if you have an area for consideration or to find out more.

#### UPDATE FROM OUR DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Following the incident when the van crashed at the eastern end of the village, I have visited the scene and spoken to residents. As of noon on 25 May I am still waiting for a response from WBC officers to my questions and concerns. The Newbury Weekly News and Penny Post have also visited to speak to residents. I am incredibly frustrated that this has happened again. As residents will know, the parish council bought a 'vehicle activated sign' with some of their own funds and match funding I secured from WBC, but this took a while to install. Parish councillor Liz Dray is doing a great job of collecting data from the sign. vehicles Speeding can be reported to https://www.westberks.gov.uk/article/35984/Rep ort-Speeding-Traffic Rest assured I am pursuing this matter and looking at all our options.

I have applied to WBC for match funding for the ongoing renovations to the village hall. Thanks to parish councillor Alan Bloor for submitting this application. We will know by mid-June whether it is successful. Last year we secured funding for the village hall so fingers crossed we will be successful this time too.

#### **NEWS FROM THE ILSLEYS SCHOOL**

We have had another few very busy weeks at The Ilsleys since the children have returned from their Easter break! From National Curriculum Test preparation, to starting yoga lessons, to inviting in people from the emergency services, we have been doing it all!

Here is a run-down of what some of the classes have been doing over the past few weeks. Enjoy!

#### **ARCTIC CLASS**

What a fantastic few weeks of learning we have had following our theme 'Emergency! Emergency!'

In Literacy recently, the children have been writing some instructions for how to put a bandage on. We started the week by learning how to put a bandage on someone else and we then practised this by using a partner and speaking out each step as we went along. This helped the children understand each step of the process. We learnt about the features of instructions, such as numbered steps, time sequencing words and verbs so we could use these in our own set of instructions.

In Numeracy, we have been learning how to share and divide between, 2, 5 and 10. We have learnt what 'equal' means and how we can ensure our groups are equal when sharing and dividing by a set amount. The children have been using concrete resources such as blocks as well as pictorial representations to help them. From this, the children have been able to write a division number sentence to show their answer.

In Curriculum, the children have been learning all about Grace Darling, whose heroism founded the RNLI. The children learnt about her life and what it was like to live back in the Victorian era. We discussed how our lives have changed and from this the children were able to make comparisons between living in the Victorian era and modern day.

#### **PACIFIC CLASS**

Pacific have had another exciting few weeks! The highlight has to be winning the football match on Wednesday with 5 goals - Ted scored 2, Jack scored 2 and Milo scored 1! Well done all of those who played. A close second will be the cricket coaching we had last Friday afternoon. Everyone had a great time playing the activities set us for us. Our favourite game was hitting the 7 balls as hard and as fast as we could and then getting as many runs as possible whilst the fielding team had to put them back where they started from.

We are also really enjoying Music! Mrs Barrett played us Mamma Mia by Abba and we thought about what type of music it was. We decided it was pop music, especially after we compared it to We Will Rock You by Queen. We have decided that we will learn the words to the song so we will be able to perform it in an assembly. In Literacy, we have been writing our own stories. We have taken our inspiration from How to be a Viking by Cressida Cowell and we have written about someone or something which overcomes a fear. We have been thinking very hard about writing lots but also making sure our presentation and vocabulary choices are maintained.

In Maths, the Year 3s and 4s have been practising all their skills at subtracting increasingly larger numbers. Year 2 had a lot of fun learning how to measure accurately and how to choose the most appropriate units of measure. We all agreed that using kilometres to measure a table would be rather silly!

#### ATLANTIC CLASS

What a super busy few weeks we have had in Atlantic Class! I can't believe we have finally completed our NCTs, for the first time since 2019! week What an amazing amount of work they have put in -I am so, so proud of each and every one of them.

In other news, Atlantic have been learning about Governments and Leaders in the UK. As part of this, we have been busy finding out more about the Queen. The children have found out what 'Head of State' means and also lots of other interesting information about her reign. They have enjoyed using Queenie (a member of our Cognitive Crew) to generate their own questions and conducting their own research to find out more.

In RE, the children have continued to compare and contrast both the Christian and Sikh faiths. They have learnt some interesting new vocabulary, including:

- Monotheistic
- Benevolent
- Omnipotent
- Omniscient

They have also enjoyed thinking about their perceptions of themselves versus others' perceptions of them, and linking this to different views on God. Katie Edwards, Assistant Headteacher
