### WEST ILSLEY FETE

Following the 1998 Fete, please will all local organisations hoping for a contribution from the funds raised write to Steve Price, West Ilsley Fete Committee, Manor Farm Barn, West Ilsley RG20 7AJ. Please ensure that such requests are received by August 22nd 1998 in time for the Committee distribution meeting shortly thereafter.

Several organisations have indicated, and we tend to agree, that the Public meeting we have traditionally held to discuss distribution of the Fete proceeds creates some embarrassment for organisations who by the very nature of the limited supply of funds we have available feel they are competing with each other for a generous settlement at the meeting itself. As the distribution is, in any event, ultimately a matter for the Committee we wonder if perhaps we can dispense with this and simply advise those applying for funds of the outcome once decided.

With this in mind, when writing to the Committee can we ask that:

- a) a brief description of the requirement is provided
- b) whether the donation sought will cover all or only part of the cost and

c) the timescale for completion of the project.

If a donation is sought to cover the running costs please do say so.

Initial indications are fairly positive and whilst it is impossible to fulfil everybody's expectations we are nevertheless confident that the benefits will be obvious to those applying for funds.

### WEST ILSLEY MILLENNIUM CELEBRATIONS

Following the proposed events put forward by villagers and subsequent voting, a proposal (see attached) has been received by the Millennium Committee for a project which would incorporate two of the top four voted events. The Millennium Committee considered the project at its meeting on 7 July and unanimously agreed that, provided it now receives the approval of the majority of members of the village, it was worthy of pursuing. In excess of £3,000 has recently been spent on renovating the village pond, and the project was seen as a long term enhancement to this area. As far as at present can be ascertained from Parish records, the area is "Common Land" and planning permission would need to be sought. It would be intended to seek funding under the Millennium Festival "small awards" (up to £5,000) and if this was successful it would enable other funds raised to be released for other proposed events. the Parish Council has also welcomed the proposal, but will consider the long-term implications re maintenance at its meeting in September before it can fully endorse the project. Members of the village have the opportunity to make their views known at this meeting.

### WEST ILSLEY FETE 1998

This year we were faced with a potential "double-whammy" - our "Tim" threatening to reach the finals at Wimbledon - again - and England playing rather well in the World Cup - at least for a time. That the Wimbledon Finals and the World Cup were both staged on successive Sundays in early July explains our

reluctant decision to hold the Fete on July 19th - and once again the gods were kind to us. Rather kinder, in fact, than they were to Henman and to England who rather mucked in up be keeping stiff upper lips whilst losing in the best British tradition. Fortunately though, after weeks of weather more suited to ducks and fish than fetes and hot dogs, Sunday dawned if not exactly bright then most decidedly warm, and the 30 seconds of rain we had at 11am served only to freshen the grass and top up the pond.

First Saturday though - can anyone who was there claim *not* to have enjoyed the pre-Fete "do"? Following the grand tradition laid down by John and Anke in previous years, the Millennium Committee stepped in to organise and execute a wonderful opener to the weekend of fund-raising. It is always difficult to single out individual contributors but special thanks must obviously go to Avice, Annie, Anne Wond and Mickey Brown for organising the affair, and thanks are also due to the army of helpers who willingly prepared salads, desserts and mountains of baked potatoes; others helped behind the bar or on the Raffle.

Sunday, and many of us brought our hangovers and our tired legs to the Recreation Ground early and once again starred the morning-long process of brining all those paper plans to reality. The stalwarts arrived as always - the "Village Hall Tea Brigade" brought cakes, cream teas and coffees; the Evergreen's table literally groaned with the weight of multi-coloured, multi-flavoured cakes; the Skittles, the Aunt Sally, the Golf Putting, the Horse Shoeing, the Plant and Book stalls all arrived and set-up in their usual positions. There were a few new attractions - badge-making for the children in the main Marquee, Guide Dogs and the Fire Engine Rescue Vehicle to name but a few. If there was disappointment in the number of stalls at first, it soon became evident that the Fete has in any event adopted a life of its own - with the Dog Show, Bar and BBQ (and what excellent burgers they were), the well-attended and colourful Produce Show, the School Children dancing, Mr Wiggy the Punch and Judy man, the Shinfield Shambles Dance Troop (where did they get that name?) the "roller-coaster" ride, Flyte Entertainments, Treasure Hunts and Tombolas, Art Exhibitions and competitions - all contributed in ways large and small to a good day enjoyed by all.

We do know that we took £491 on the gates between 12.30 and 4.00pm - representing perhaps 800 people including children, and our survey has thrown up some interesting facts about the people who visited us from as far afield as Bradford and North Wales! We shall use that information in the future to target our advertising and promotional efforts more effectively.

Highlights - Jemma Gore's face when winning the Colling Cup (and thank you to her and Tessa Muir on Saturday night for selling ALL the raffle tickets!); Peter Bartaby's amusing commentary; the sudden arrival of multitudes of owners from the Stables which precipitated a rush on burgers and drinks late in the afternoon (we kept hoping the Queen might put in an appearance but regrettably not); the "mini-explosion" under the BBQ which sent burgers and sausages in all directions: dog owners crawling through the tunnel whilst their dogs looked on! The list goes on.

It is impossible to thank everyone who contributed in so many ways to the success of the day - as usual you know who you are and how much we rely upon your continued support. That the day will have raised significant money is not in doubt - and the Village will be better for your efforts.
