## Mobile Phones.

If your mobile phone is stolen it is bad enough that it is expensive to replace. There is also the hassle of losing all of those stored numbers, messages, pictures and downloads...So how can you protect your phone.



Don't leave your phone on

tables in pubs or restaurants and try not to use it in crowded places

• Avoid using your phone near a tube or train station or when getting on or off a bus. Wait until you are further away from the stop or station.

• If you need to make a call in public, make it brief and keep an eye out for those around you. Remember, if you are chatting you're less likely to be aware of what's going on around you.

• Don't walk while you are sending a text message.

• Always ask yourself "Is it safe to answer my phone right now"

• Register your phone with your network operator. This means they can block calls if your phone is stolen which means that the thief cant use it.. You can also register mobile equipment on 'MEND' at <u>www.menduk.org</u> (MEND, or Mobile Equipment National Database, is a police-approved programme for registering mobile phones and other mobile IT equipment.)

• Record your registration number (also known as the IMEI or International Mobile Equipment Identity) and phone number. Keep theses numbers in separate and safe. You can find your IMEI No. by keying in \*#06# into most phones or by looking underneath the battery.

• If your phone is stolen, report it to your network operator (or call 08701 123 123) and to the Police...Your phone can be blocked, just like a stolen credit card. Once blocked it cannot be used again.

JOHN COX

JOHN COX who lived at 6 Firtree Cottages for 23 years died on September 4<sup>th</sup> aged 96 years. The following is an extract from the Racing Post: "John Cox, the former jump jockey who broke Brigadier Gerard as a yearling, has died at the age of 96. A jump jockey in the 1930s, he was employed by Peter Cazalet and Frank Cundell, and was working for John Hislop when Brigadier Gerard was foaled in 1968. Hislop wrote in his book, The Brigadier, Our stud groom at that time, Cox, who later went back into racing, was a good man with horses, quiet, gentle and an excellent rider. Cox drove him about the stud and when the time came for a saddle to be put on him he humped his back once and thenceforth never put a foot out of place." John was cremated at Basingstoke Crematorium on September 13th 2005.

## CRIME REPORT

Our thanks to PC Andrew Buckingham (Hungerford Police 08458 505 505) who emails us with his NWN article, from which we extract items which may be valuable in keeping villagers alert to what's going on in the area:

1 Sept

Quad bikes on the patch are being targeted by thieves with a green Kawasaki having been stolen from Home Farm Woolley between 11am and 8pm last Wednesday 24th and a navy blue



double horse box stolen from a farm in Upper Lambourn last Saturday night. This is the second theft of a horse box in the area in recent weeks. Theft of farm machinery and often diesel fuel on a rural area such as Hungerford's, is I'm afraid ever prevalent. Please remember to lock and secure all machinery and if possible keep it out of sight. If you see a suspicious vehicle or person enter your yard, if you can make a note of the number, it might be nothing but then again it might be just the piece in the jig-saw we need. 15 Sept

During Friday night three isolated farm buildings in Boxford, Weston and Leckhampstead were broken into and agricultural machinery was stolen.

Overnight between Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> offenders smashed a rear window at All Saints Church West Ilsley and gained entry. Forensic samples from

the scene are currently being analysed. If anyone has any information please contact me.

22 Sept

Last Friday between midday and 4.30pm riding tack was stolen from stables in Ermine Street Lambourn. This is not an isolated incident so please make sure all tack is locked away and out of sight. If you can take it home and don't leave it hanging in the stable in a remote field.

A reddish 'Yucca' type plant in a blue pot was stolen from the front of a house in Clough Drive Hermitage last Friday night. Did you see a person with such a specimen stuffed under their arm that night?

Have you got a caravan and do you keep it on your drive? If you do, make sure that it is locked and secured as two men with Irish accents were eyeing one up on a driveway in Priory Road Hungerford last week. Be aware that caravans have been stolen from driveways in the past.

29 Sept

Between Monday 19<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> a stable and shed located off the B4000 at Lambourn Woodlands were broken into, a compressor, generator and a portable oxyacetylene kit was stolen.



Extracts from Sept Parish council Meeting (full minutes can be found on the village noticeboard.)

### 1. Matters arising

The footpath at the back of The Maltings has been cut.

The trees overhanging the pavement outside West Ilsley house have still not been trimmed back. Two letters have been sent to No 4 without success. The Clerk to inform the Council.

#### 5..Correspondence received

Letter received back (4<sup>th</sup> August) from Melvyn May, Highways manager indicating again that the ditch alongside the Recreation Ground is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of the land adjacent to it. The Council are unable to arrange cleansing of private ditches.

The silt/gravel deposits that were dumped on the side of Catmore Road after the storms, were done so as a matter of urgency, according to the Council, and will be removed when Bury Lane is swept. This has not happened.

The Clerk will respond to the Council asking them to return to remove the gravel and to explain why a "private" ditch that was expertly dug out a few years ago is now being left to overgrow.

Richard Benyon, MP has offered to hold a Question and Answer (iMPact) session in the Downland villages. The Parish Council thought that we should invite him to do this and also to try to secure him as our guest speaker for the

<del>Parish Assembly, next May. The Clerk sha</del>ll contact his office.

7. New Charity Deed between West Ilsley and Lockinge Estate

Mrs Ryan (Village Hall) has replied positively and Mr Beech (Cricket Club) positively with comments. The PC will request a Memorandum of Understanding between all parties and The Clerk will approach both for their working documents. The Clerk will also ask Mr Pike, Solicitor to proceed to set up the Trust.

#### 11 .Open forum

WIN photocopying - this is currently being done Free of Charge by volunteers. Unfortunately this can no longer continue so WIN is in danger of folding if suitable sponsorship is not found. The cost for out-sourcing all photocopying and collating would be £50/month. All Councillors agreed that it was essential that WIN should continue as a service to the village. To this end, The Clerk will follow up with requests for sponsorship from the West IIsley committees, the stables and Oakes Brothers (Cllr Hagen).

WI Web site - plans are underway (coordinated by Andrea Cook and thanks to Mr Briggs-Watson) to update and enhance our web site. PC minutes, updates and information about all committees/activities will be included if possible. All offered their support.
