Following many years of success the village campout is back! This is an event for all villagers and ex-villagers. For the children an adult and tent are required. #### COUNTRY NOTES

#### 13th May

Thirteen, a number considered by some to be unlucky, it certainly was in the past for young rooks as traditionally the 13th of May was the day of the annual rook shoot. The young birds known as branchers standing beside their nests, fullygrown but hardly able to fly, made easy targets. The succulent breasts of these birds were destined to provide the main ingredient in a rook pie; a century's old dish that provided a welcome nutritional supplement for country people. The following quotation from Charles Dicken's Pickwick Papers alludes to a rook shoot;

"Stand aside then, now for it". The boy shouted, and shook a branch with a nest on it. Half a dozen young rooks in violent conversation, flew out to ask what the matter was. The old gentleman fired by way of reply. Down fell one bird, and off flew the others. 'Take him up, Joe,' said the old gentleman. There was a smile upon the youth's face as he advanced. Indistinct visions of rookpie floated through his imagination. He laughed as he retired with the bird--it was a plump one.

Some believe that the nursery rhyme "Four & twenty blackbirds baked in a pie" refers to rooks rather than the common blackbird?

It must have been some pie if it contained fortyeight rook breasts!

Returning to the theme of luck, in the past, estate owners encouraged rooks to nest near their houses as they would bring good luck, and it was considered that to kill them, or to attempt to drive them away, would be to invite ill luck on the family. Discussing this subject over a pint in The Harrow recently, Mick Channon added a little Hampshire lore into the Berkshire musings, "rooks live near the money and when the rooks leave so does the money". **Perdix**

### Our Mission to support the Downland Children's Centres

The Downland Children's Centres, located in Chieveley and Pangbourne, serve all the villages of the Downland including Brightwalton and West Ilsley, Compton, Hermitage and Yattendon. Many of their services are 'universal' offering support to all pregnant mothers and families with babies and children aged under 5. Some support is particularly offered to families facing challenging situations.

As part of our mission to the communities we serve, our churches are developing some support for the work of the Children's centres. This falls into three main areas:

• Volunteer driving to enable families in the outlying villages to travel to their nearest centre. We all know how difficult life can be living in a small village with very little public transport when we cannot drive or do not have access to a car. Proper processes are in place to safeguard drivers and families. The

Downland Volunteer drivers, whilst providing a most valued service to our communities, are unable to transport families with pre-school children and using taxis is so very expensive: to take a family from Brightwalton to Chieveley and back costs £60! Some of our churches are donating small amounts of money to provide a mileage allowance for volunteer driving.

- Volunteer support at the Stay Play and Learn sessions, providing extra pairs of hands to help families during the sessions. If you enjoy playing with your grandchildren, you'll enjoy this.
- Volunteer administrator: assisting with the smooth running of the centres, using skills you may have gained in previous employment, making people welcome.

A copy of the Patient's Charter follows:

#### The Downland Practice Patient Charter

Everyone at the Downland Practice tries to work together with our patients to provide the best possible care. We want our service to be safe, effective, caring, responsive and well led.

#### We are committed to:

- Treating patients and carers with courtesy and respect
- Involving patients in all decisions about their treatment and ensuring informed consent is given prior to any procedure.
- Ensuring absolute confidentiality of medical records within the limits of the law
- Abiding by legal and regulatory obligations including Data Protection and Health and Safety regulations.

#### We aim to:

- Offer our patients an appointment with a doctor within 3 working days
- See patients who consider their condition to be medically urgent on the same day
- Answer the telephone promptly
- Keep our patients informed if their appointment time is more than 30 minutes behind schedule
- Print repeat prescriptions within 48 hours of request.
- Provide patients with access to their medical records as the law permits subject to the recommended fee.

We welcome comments and suggestions about our service and encourage patient involvement through our Patient Representation Group. We ask patients to:

- Treat all staff with respect
- Keep appointments or provide as much notice as possible if there is a need to cancel or rebook
- Only request a home visit if their medical condition prevents them from attending surgery
- Only contact the out of-hours service if their medical condition prevents them from waiting until the next surgery
- Inform the surgery of any changes of name address or telephone number
- Request repeat prescriptions by returning the repeat prescription form, online (when patients register for this service) or by fax but not by telephone

- Take responsibility for ordering their repeat prescription, respecting the processing period takes a minimum of two working days. This helps to ensure that our patients receive their medication in a timely manner
- Make any requests for access to medical records in writing.

We want to work with our patients to provide the best possible service.


