

FARMING NEWS

The 2014 Harvest was completed on the 20th August and we think this is the earliest we have finished for many years - very unusual before the August Bank Holiday! The weather was not so kind for the latter part due to an abundance of showers and cooler temperatures.

The yields from the Spring Barley and the Winter



Wheat were both above average and the new variety of Winter Wheat called Crusoe outyielded the older variety, Solstice, by we think, approximately one tonne per hectare, therefore, а good reason to be dropping Solstice and growing Crusoe next season. The new variety of wheat this season that we are trialling is called Skyfall – we love the name! The boys have noticed whilst combining and corn carting there have been an abundance of wildlife in the fields, especially Patridges, Hares and Red Kites.

All the barley straw this year was baled and is used for the horses at Mick Channon's stables and the surplus is sold to Wales and the West



Country. We have baled very little wheat straw since there is no market.

We have always said there is more to do after harvest than during and we are now busy planting next year's crop of Winter Oilseed Rape. The work includes cultivating, spraying off volunteers (seeds from last year's crop) plus freshly germinated weeds, then planting the rape and rolling afterwards to create a firm seed bed so that we can achieve a good germination and prevent slug damage.

The sheep have not required too much attention over the harvest period, except feet trimming and applying the chemical Click to help prevent fly strike (maggots!). The beef cattle, in the meantime, are still enjoying the sunshine. Peter Carlisle

NATURE NOTES

9th August

Sunny, fresh westerly wind, sign of the approaching tail of hurricane Bertha, rain overnight.

Several whitethroats along the Catmore road, their scolding churring calls from between the hogweed stems, bolder than normal, perhaps juveniles showing less caution than the adults? A flock of fifty or sixty finches, mostly linnets with a sprinkling of goldfinches, flitting from blackthorn to hawthorn. The green haws of last week now have a partial pink blush, miniature Granny Smiths turning to Pippins.

16th August

2-300 lesser black backed gulls on the recently cultivated Top Wood Hill field east of the Barracks. The flock increasing in size as singletons arrive from the northeast. Fifty years ago it was rare to see gulls of any species inland, if seen, then some sage would pronounce with much wisdom "there must be a great storm at sea to drive them this far inland"! Now they are a common sight attracted by a plentiful source of food in refuse tips and safe overnight roosting sites on reservoirs.

Above Starveall a wheatear, sentinel like, perched on a stack of straw bales. Approaching closer it flew off to be joined by another, these birds will be on passage from their summer breeding grounds in northern Britain to winter in central Africa.

A murder (collective noun) of eight carrion crows together in the stubble giving a lie to that country saying "You see a rook on it's own that be a crow, see a crowd of crows they be rooks".

Below Starveall a flock of thirty young swallows fly low amongst the grazing sheep, one minute hawking for insects the next seeming to play chase with each other. Two yellow wagtails on the track, the appearance of these beautifully dainty birds along with the earlier wheatears heralds the end of summer. Perdix August 2014

note from the PC minutes

At the July Parish Council meeting the proposed new procedure for allocating any precept money to village committees was underway and three applications had been received: All Saints Church, Village Hall and WI Website. Each was reviewed in turn.

All Saints up to £6100 to replenish reserves after repairing the church roof plasterwork.

Village Hall £5000 to match grant received and to be used for upgrading heating, insulating and Decoration was underway and self liahtina. funded.

WI Website £62 for annual domain name registration and site hosting fee.

A few further details were requested. The website is likely to be funded by WIN, but all three will be summarized* in WIN for opportunities for queries and comments from the village followed by a Parish Council funding allocation/decision at the September PC meeting.


