Jim Trotman – Area Commander Thames Valley Police

Mr Trotman and his colleagues kindly spent time discussing their policy regarding Raves. These are growing in number but equally the Police have had increasing success stopping them. Tell tale signs e.g. broken gate locks, large groups assembling in the M4/M40 services and notices on the side of fields usually indicate that one may be about to happen. At this point up to 90 riot trained officers may be needed to halt one. As this is a limited resource, it is the urgency and persistence of complaints of villagers that will bring the police out sooner. Therefore the Police stressed that the first thing to do is to phone the police if you think one may be about to start and to complain once it has started. The number to phone is 08458 505 505.

Correspondence received

Letter received back from Melvyn May, Highways manager indicating that the ditch alongside the Recreation Ground is the responsibility of the owner or occupier of the land adjacent to the ditch.

This was a disappointing reply as it seems the Council have been active by recently clearing away loose gravel from the recent storm. They had done so in the Catmore road area by dumping it in the verges and therefore preventing flow of water but had not cleared the gravel left on Bury Lane.

The Play Ground working group.

The group were pleased to announce that a site had been approved by both Lockinge Estate and The Carlisle family. This is an area approximately 15 sqm in the field at the back of The Recreation Ground to the right hand side of the tennis court. The group confirmed that the PC will need to take responsibility for insurance and maintenance and that the next stage is to Question all villagers to confirm that a Play Ground is still sought after .

Traffic Management Group

The group confirmed that they had carried out a leaflet drop recently to raise the profile of speeding through the village. Leaflets had been dropped through all doors plus Mr Channon's stables. There had been no progress with moving the 30mph signs further out from the village boundaries. This decision may be imminent. Dist. Cllr Chandler offered to follow up this decision.
