

#### WELL READING



First thing to say is that it has definitely gone down over the last month. Well readings are usually at their highest in February/March each year and at their lowest in October/November and in one sense the last 6 months was typical. Last autumn the low reading was 17.97 metres, but following the wettest winter for at least 250 years the reading sailed past the previous record of 2.89 metres in 2001 to set a new record of 2.48 metres. For a lot of January and the beginning of February the water level was increasing at quite astonishing rates. For example between the 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> February the level rose by a record 4.24 metres. At one point Liz thought the well-meter must be broken!



However, following the recent dry spell the water level is decreasing by about 30-50 mm a day and as we go to press it has now dropped over half a metre from its peak to about 3.08 metres. This is still significantly higher than last year's peak reading, but records show that the decrease should continue steadily as we go into summer. And I know the farmers will complain, but we need a long dry summer to get the water table down so that we don't have a re-run of this next winter.

Finally it is interesting to see that a recently published report by the UK Met Office says we should expect our summers to become drier and hotter, and our winters to become milder and wetter. So in future we need to keep a good eye on the well-readings and the weather to give us as much advance notice of any likely flooding as possible.



# A LIGHTHEARTED INTERLUDE IN WORRYING TIMES IN WEST ILSLEY

A number of villagers know we discovered a mammoth's tooth when digging the deep footings of our stable/garage to the right of the cottages in 1978. James, our middle son was 5 years old at the time and was the first to spot this plum pudding size piece of prehistoric history. " Look, Daddy....a dinosaurs tooth! It certainly resembled tooth structure, with it's large, grinding molar surface covered in striations of cement and dentine, rather fragile, with traces of root structure now fossilised. The curator of Newbury Museum came out to view it and pronounced it a Woolly Mammoth's molar tooth. Simon, our youngest many years later, was working London.....\*Let`s go to the National History Museum, Dad."....we duly did..... found a mammoth skeleton and looking upwards into it's cavernous head we knew our tooth was then a right upper molar. The mammoth has only 8 teeth...2 up and 2 down each side. It weighs 10 lb and although not carbon dated...it was thought to be between 30,000 and 3 million years old! So, West Ilsley in prehistoric times, maybe, was a river bed, where mammoths and dinosaurs roamed freely and came to drink at the river's edge. The amount of water coming into our cottages recently entirely supports that view! John and Elaine Clemenger.

## Flood support schemes Repair and renew grant

- Grants of up to £5k
- For homeowners and businesses
- For property flooded between 1st December 2013 and 31 March 2014
- · Administered by local authorities
- Only for funding measures to improve resilience to flooding over and above repairs normally covered by insurance
- Properties not eligible if they are to benefit from a community level scheme which would reduce level of flood risk below significant (needs liaison with Environment Agency)
- If property currently benefit from existing or agreed Property Level Protection
   Scheme funding should only be used to take total of that whole package to a max of £5k

- Package of work to be identified following survey by competent professional
- Evidence that work has been undertaken will need to be provided
- No clear detail of how it will work and how funding will flow to local authorities (discussions to take place between Govt./ Insurers/ Local authorities

### Business Rates Flooding Relief

- To be administered by local authorities using existing discretionary relief powers
- Fully funded by central government, no limit imposed
- Expectation that relief will be granted
- For property flooded between 1st December 2013 and 31 March 2014
- Not applicable to property with RV £10m or greater
- Need to consider extent of adverse effect on business activity, ignore very small or insignificant impact
- Relief for 3 months irrespective of how long flooding adversely affected business activity
- Relief to be allowed after all normal relief accounted for (e.g. small business relief)
- Relief may continue if change of ratepayer in the period or property split/merged
- Empty property not eligible
- Relief for periods outside scope to be funded 49% by council in line with rate retention arrangements

### **Business Support Scheme**

- To be administered by local authorities
- Initial £50k grant to Council, 2nd tranche to be delivered in March when more detail of flood impacts available
- For business flooded and for those whose business has been adversely affected by flooding

- For small and medium sized business to implement business recovery plans
- Claim for costs (immediate clean up, materials, exceptional business costs, temporary accommodation, business continuity planning, and marketing)
- Intention is a simple scheme, quick provision of support, minimum bureaucracy
- Need to identify that hardship/loss was due to flooding and not poor business practice (e.g. no insurance)
- Can be used to help those indirectly affected (no or limited access to premises, suppliers or customers)
- Reference made to average claims of £2,500 for similar recovery schemes

#### Council Tax discounts

- Funding up to £4m available across country
- Local authorities not given individual allocations
- Use local discretion
- Will be used to provide council tax rebate for up to 3 months

# West Berkshire Council Tax and Business Rates

- Business premises are being given up to 3 months relief under existing discretionary powers

#### COMPTON DAY CENTRE UPDATE

Despite all our village hall committees' efforts, the Compton Day Centre has stopped operating in its dav care format. The existing local downland residents who need day care provision has apparently been declining. It appears that this is mainly due to West Berkshire Council increasing their minimum criteria of need for day care provision and maybe not always interviewing with a carer or relative present to give a true evaluation of need. This has the knock on effect of less people able to get day care funding. The existing day care provider has not renewed its contract due to insufficient clients to make it economically viable. The committee has now changed its name to the 'Wilkins Centre' in honour of Joan Wilkins, MBE, who did such a lot for our village all her life and whose efforts probably made the day care centre possible in the first place.

Various options are now being considered by the village hall committee in an effort to keep the building open in some form.

For example: a coffee/tea drop in type centre. Are there any volunteers in the area interested in manning the centre on a rota basis to provide this service? We have two volunteers who have

expressed an interest at the moment. Various activities could be started, cards, bingo, gardening or computer clubs as a few ideas. The Autumn Years Club already use it once a fortnight on a Tuesday afternoon.

If nothing like this is possible, is there anyone in our downland villages that either knows someone or an organisation or business that would like to use the building? Would anyone want to hire it as a tea/coffee shop during the day? It could be used for example as a tea room, hairdressers, drop in centre, small office. It is a Rollalong prefabricated building bought new in 1997 and situated at the rear of the hall by the rec car park. # BUCKLEBURY/DOWNLANDS NEIGHBOURHOOD UPDATE FOR MARCH

The Bucklebury and Downlands Neighbourhood Team cover the areas of Bucklebury, Downlands, Cold Ash, Chieveley, Hermitage, Midgham and Woolhampton.

The latest crime statistics can be found by visiting <a href="https://www.police.uk">www.police.uk</a> (opens new window) This website provides you with helpful information about crime and policing in your area. Enter your postcode, town, village or street into the search box, and get instant access to street-level crime maps and data, as well as details of the neighbourhood police team and 'Have Your Say Events'. The level of crime and anti-social behaviour in the area

remains below average compared with the rest of England and Wales. The crime rate in your neighbourhood for the period April 2013 to January 2014 inclusive as opposed to the same period in 2012/13 has reduced by 7%, with burglaries down by 14% and criminal damage down by 18%.

The neighbourhood has three priorities; rural crime, speeding, and anti social use of motor vehicles. If you have any concerns about crime or disorder in the Bucklebury & Downlands neighbourhood please email the address below or call the non emergency number for Thames Valley Police, 101.

On 3rd February speed enforcement was carried out on High Street, Compton between 2.20pm and 3.20pm. One motorist, a local, was caught speeding at 36mph and was reported for speeding. On 5th February enforcement was carried out on Main Street, West Ilsley between 8am and 9am. Three motorists were caught speeding between 36 and 44mph and were reported for speeding.

At this time of year hare coursing again becomes an issue. If you see vehicles driving off road at any time of the day, or lights in fields at night then please call us. Likewise if you see persons walking on fields in a line with dogs then also call us.

Anti social use of motor vehicles, primarily 4X4's and motorbikes using various rights of way causing criminal damage and annoyance is a new priority for the neighbourhood. Eleven Section 59 warnings (which enable police to seize vehicles if caught twice in a twelve month period) have been issued in February and two motorists issued with fixed penalty tickets for driving off road. If you see vehicles driving off road or using restricted byways then please report it to us on 101.

Please make sure you report all crimes and any instances of anti social behaviour to Thames Valley Police so we can deal accordingly. Too often we are receiving calls from your parish councilors of incidents that should be reported to the police and too much time has passed by to be able to deal effectively.

Finally, we would like to say farewell to Sgt Paula Morgan and welcome Sgt Alan Hawkett to the Bucklebury and Downlands Neighbourhood Team.If you see him out and about please do not hesitate to approach him and say hello!


