And welcome to Daniel and Rachel Hudson who have moved into 33 Church Way.




Anne Carlisle On Sunday July 8th at the West Ilsley Fete, the Evergreens will have a cake, jam and anything edible stall, contributions

PLAY AREA

Plans for a new play area for the far end of the Recreation Ground will go on display at the Fete on July 8 and in the Village Hall from 2pm to 4.30pm on July 9. I



hope everyone who's interested will get the chance to take a look and have their say. The play area will then be the first item on the agenda at the Parish Council meeting in the Village Hall at 7pm on July 9, and everyone is welcome to come along and make their views known.

This will be the culmination of more than two years of efforts to get some play equipment for children in the village. The starting point was a questionnaire in the West Ilsley News to gauge support for a play area. We received one objection and 22 responses in favour - on behalf of 45 children.

On that basis, the Parish Council then set about finding a site and some money.

With the help of the Carlisle family, a possible site was identified to the right of the tennis courts as you look at the Recreation Ground from the Harrow. Another site in the far right-hand corner as you look from the Harrow has since been proposed and we'll be running through all the possibilities at our July 9 meeting.

As for money, the Winter Warmer, which attracted the support of more than 80 people in the village, got the fund-raising for the play area off to a flying start and West Berks Council backed our successful application for a grant from the Big Lottery Fund. So we now have more than £20,000, which is enough for a decent little play area but nothing on a grand scale - really goodquality, rustic-looking, wooden equipment which blends in with its surroundings is fantastically expensive.

The position now is that we have some provisional plans which we'd like to consult as many people on as possible - parents, the Cricket Club, the people whose homes overlook the Recreation Ground and everyone else with an interest. The Parish Council and Playground Committee are happy to answer any questions before July 9 and hope we can come up with something that provides the maximum benefit with the minimum disruption.

THE VILLAGE TENNIS COURT

This year we celebrate 25 years of playing tennis on our very own village tennis court. It was opened by Willie Carson in July 1982 and has since proved popular with young and old alike as an "Open Court", for

villagers and the surrounding areas. It has been used happily by many hundreds of people over the course of these years and saw major repair work done to the surface in 1992. As mentioned in the recent Parish Assembly, I well remember the early days when, with the front fence taken down, the heavy cricket roller was used to "bed down" the surface damaged by severe frost. Since then the trees have grown and offered protection against both frost and hot sun.

Many village residents have done a sterling job on the management committee over these years notably Denis Gilmore and John Verney. As founder members, these two people, along with Elaine and myself, were concerned that young village children were playing tennis in the street and we campaigned for a village court. The Parish Council helped us gain a grant and Mr Christopher Loyd agreed the site. Norman Carlisle gave generous help on the dig out - forming the foundation and eventual plateau and slopes (so popular with children today). Jan Wiejak, an excellent chairman, in 1992 successfully won us a grant for major repair work. We also remember the Booking Clerks, Mick Bishop at The Harrow, Julia Rockall at the village shop (how we still miss it!) and Elaine at the Veterinary Surgery. They all have given generously of their spare time to 'log' people in and out (one chap kept the key for nearly a month, played regularly and didn't realize he had to pay for the privilege - he obviously had value for money!). We also thank the Cricket Club, who have looked after our plateau and slopes with regular grass cutting for many years. This has

been a real bonus to us, is much appreciated and we hope it may continue as before – which takes me to the future of the Court.

Our present small management committee is retiring at the end of this month - after nearly 25 vears' service. As chairman, I am willing to act as caretaker for this summer and Elaine is willing to continue as Booking Clerk until someone else can be found. We are asking urgently for volunteers to run the court on behalf of the village. It is not an onerous job. The court has recently been professionally cleaned and the reports are that it is in very good condition. The finances of the court are also in a sound position - with just over £1,000 in National Savings. We all now feel the need for a new, perhaps younger, enthusiastic committee that will manage the court, keeping it as an 'open' activity for all to enjoy. We are notifying the parish council of the impending retirements, although at the annual parish assemblies for the last three years we have intimated our hope for new members to come forward. Christopher Loyd, landowner of the tennis area stipulated 25 years ago that there should be 3 village residents willing to act as 'guarantors' to the court, ie persons willing to be financially responsible for returning the land to agricultural use, should the need ever arise. Of the three guarantors, only Jackie Atkins and myself remain. We are both retiring from this responsibility this summer and I thank Jackie for her generous participation. Other arrangements will have to be made and I will ask the Parish Council and Mr Loyd for their views. So finally, congratulations and thanks to all those involved with the Tennis court maintenance throughout its 25 year history, and with a strong hope that volunteers or organizations may come forward to run it for the future. In the meantime, things carry on as normal.
