BUSES - And How they could solve a problem

With the very sad demise of our Village Post Office, and the fact that the likelihood of it being re-opened in the near future seems remote, the best alternative the Authorities can offer us is to go to Chieveley, Compton or Harwell. With a car none of these is too far away but without a car what is one's best option?

In my view it is Chieveley as we can now get to Chieveley by bus, leaving the Village at 45 minutes past 9 and 11 a.m. and 1, 3 and 5 p.m: Do one's Post Office business and pick up fresh bread and any forgotten grocery needs and get buses back at 34 minutes past 10 a.m; Noon and 2, 4 and 6 p.m. The journey time to and from Chieveley is about 16-18 minutes so any of the above services will allow about 25 minutes in the Shop/P.O. and as most people will know the bus stops are no more than a level 100 yard walk from the Shop.

The shop is open all day, every day, but the Post Office hours are 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Monday to Friday PLUS 2 to 5 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

WATER LEVELS

This report was received from the Environmental Agency and is collated from all the data they receive from well owners.

Alison Banks

Remember the year? Here are some key hydrometric events that happened throughout the year of 2001:

Dec 2000

- Highest ever level recorded at Rockley borehole (3 miles north-west of Marlborough) on 18/12/2000.
- The average rainfall across West Area between September 2000 and January 2001 was approximately 5 00mm. This is equivalent to a depth of 0.5 m over the entire catchment that covers and area of 6184 km and represents over three thousand million tonnes of water.

<u>Jan 2001</u>

• Extremely high groundwater levels continued to cause groundwater flooding problems resulting in

damage to many properties and roads.

• In the West Chilterns, groundwater levels continued to increase rapidly.

Feb 2001

 Groundwater levels have continued to rise in the Chilterns where Stonor borehole (5 miles north of Henley) reached 4 meters higher than any previous level.

Mar 2001

 March was very wet month throughout West Area, with rainfall totals ranging from 119 % to 169 % of the average March figures. The Berkshire Downs, West Chilterns and Thame areas all exceeded the highest ever rainfall, over the previous 6 and 12 months.

<u>May 2001</u>

• Following an exceptionally wet winter, May and June were relatively dry with below average rainfall over the whole catchment.

<u>Jul 2001</u>

 Groundwater levels continue to decrease but still remain high for the time of year, particularly in the Chalk aquifers.

<u>Sep 2001</u>

- Limestone and Chalk borehole water levels continued to fall, although levels in the Chilterns are significantly higher than this time last year.
- In contrast, groundwater levels in the Berkshire Downs were similar to last September, as groundwater tends to drain away much more quickly from this aquifer.

<u>Oct 2001</u>

- After a relatively dry summer, October was extremely wet and all areas received higher than average rainfall.
- Water level started to rise in some areas although levels in the Chalk are continuing to decline. Groundwater levels remain above maximum within the Chilterns which suggests that this area may be at risk from groundwater flooding again this winter

<u>Nov 2001</u>

- It was a very dry month throughout West Area with all areas receiving less than their average monthly rainfall.
- Groundwater levels began to rise slowly at Rockley but remain well below maximum.
- In contrast levels in the Chilterns at Stonor remain above previous maximum levels for the time of year but fortunately continue to decline.

Dec 2001

- Less likely that the problems of last winter will reoccur at any location on the Chalk.
- Heading for a very dry winter as many wells have yet to turn.

The Malthouse well turned in the first week of January with a low reading of 17m69cm.
