PRESCRIPTION DELIVERY

The following are extracts from a letter received from the Downland Practice Manager today -"When medication is collected from the dispensary we have a very clear audit trail from the arrival of drugs in the practice until they are collected by a patient (or their representative). With remote delivery sites we have no audit trail of what happens to the medication once it leaves the practice and this is what we need to address". "What we are proposing is that someone at the remote site signs for receipt of the medication and has a list of patients due to collect that week. The patient would then sign the sheet when they collect the medication". "For remote sites that are at private houses we would ask that you are in when medication is delivered, this would be at a set day and time each week. You would not be expected to be permanently on hand to give out medication but could have set times during the week when you would be available. We cannot have boxes of medication left unattended in future." There is no way that I can tie myself to

SEPTEMBER 2010

Here is the latest neighbourhood update for the Downlands from Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Dominic Bartlett. The latest crime statistics for the neighbourhood can be found at http://maps.police.uk/view/thames-valley (opens new window) All crime in the neighbourhood has fallen by 19.4 per cent compared with the same period last year (May-July). Burglary offences have reduced by 33.2 per cent and we continue to see a reduction in vehicle crime of 35.5 per cent. The team continue to conduct high visibility patrols to help prevent and detect crime out in the Downlands neighbourhood.

Although we have not received any reports of straw or hay being stolen form the Downlands area, I would like to provide some crime prevention advice to help prevent it from being stolen. If you have any small bales, consider cutting the strings as it will make it virtually impossible for anyone to walk away with. Marking the packaging with spray paint or permanent marker will make it easier to identify if it is stolen but it will also make it less desirable to potential thieves. Hay is a difficult commodity to secure in closed barns, due to its combustible properties, but securing the area around the buildings should be a priority, using the best technology you can afford. Use lockable, metal feed bins to store your bags of feed. Review your current security now, and consider where there may be vulnerable spots which may need extra security.

Our number one priority for the Downlands area is hare-coursing. The summer months after the harvest seem to be a popular time for this activity and this year has had its fair share.

We have been working closely with landowners, farmers, and gamekeepers to help prevent and disrupt this type of crime, but it is equally important that you report any information or sightings. We advise you to phone 999 if the coursing is in progress but otherwise call the 24hour Police Enquiry Centre on 0845 8 505 505.

A great example of the public working in partnership with the police was when a member of public reported a group of people who were suspected to be hare-coursing in Brightwalton. The group involved were found coursing in a nearby village and one man was arrested and had his vehicle seized.

Speeding is also a priority for the Downlands neighbourhood, during August I conducted a one hour speed check on Main Street in West Ilsley on Sunday 8 August between 3pm and 4pm. The road is a 30 mph zone and the results of the speed check are as follows –

Number of vehicles within the speed limit -21Between 31-35mph -3 Between 36mph -40mph -1

Neighbourhood Specialist Officer (NSO) PC Simon Easton conducted speed enforcement checks on Fiddlers Lane in East Ilsley between 8am - 9.30am and issued nine speeding tickets to motorists who exceeded the 30mph limit.

Property marking for push bikes is an effective way to help reduce your bike from being stolen and also helps to identify it in the event of a theft. The marking involves engraving your postcode onto your bike in a discreet place, and only takes about 15 -20 minutes.
