PARISH COUNCIL

A vacancy has been created on the Parish Council caused by the resignation of Dr Alan Muir, due to commitment to work. The Chairman thanked Dr Muir for all he has done over the past few years as a councillor.

A request for help with funding has been received from the Ilsleys School who may have to cut down on staffing levels due to the low numbers of children on role at present, hopefully the numbers will rise soon as there are so many babies and small children around the village now.

The Senior Rights of Way Officer has informed the Parish Council that the owner of Hunter's Ride is prepared to realign the fencing on the western end of Footpath 16 level with the trees.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be held on Monday 11th May at 7.00 pm followed by the Annual Parish Assembly at 8.00 pm to which everyone is invited - come and hear what has been achieved in the village over the past year.
