Summer is just around the corner

It hardly seems possible with last year's glorious summer just behind us that this year's summer is approaching very quickly.



Life at a cricket club does not just stop at the end of the season. As soon as the last match has been played the grounds men start their work to prepare the playing surface for the next season. The club members also assist by carrying out maintenance work on the pavilion and equipment. The result of which is that we play on one of the prettiest and best village grounds in the Berkshire / Oxfordshire area and this is down to the hard work of our members.

2008 was a very successful season for the club, both senior teams playing in the Oxfordshire Cricket Association (OCA) finished in the mid to top of their respective leagues. The mid week team won their league and the Sunday team played some very enjoyable friendly matches including the last match of the season in a 20-20

format against the winners of the Cherwell League (approximately seven divisions above our First Team).

Our aim is to make West Ilsley Cricket Club the club of choice for potential cricketers within our local catchment area, for both juniors and seniors. Over the last 4 years we have developed a successful youth academy (for boys and girls) which started with a handful of local boys practising their cricket. We now regularly have over 70 children attending formal coaching sessions. You only need to drive by on a Friday evening to see the success of this venture! These sessions are run by a number of English Cricket Board (ECB) qualified coaches who we have developed through our own club, with 3 more due to qualify this winter.

The success of this is really good news for the local area. We have teams playing in the under 9, 11, 13, 15 & 17 boys Berkshire League plus an under 13 girls team, who all performed well in their respective leagues.

The icing on the cake is that Louise Parkes, Georgetta Evans, Agatha Bebbington, and Nicole Beesley have all been selected to play cricket for the county. West Ilsley is seen as the beacon of girl's cricket in West Berks.

Lets not forget the boys, Adam Barnes was selected for Berkshire U10 winter squad and joins Tom Scriven who has again been selected to represent U10 and U11 at county level where he has scored 550 runs in first 2 seasons for the county including 5 half centuries. Robbie Dibble and Rob Lawson have both represented the West Berkshire district side whilst George Storton was cruelly denied the chance with a broken leg.

In June this year our junior club, in conjunction with Brightwalton Primary School will take part in the Kwik Cricket festival. Further details will be posted on the club website in due course.

Joining the OCA resulted in the cricket club having to provide independent umpires. We are fortunate to have four umpires on our books (more than any other club of our size), three of whom have been trained by the ECB, one fully qualified. The junior academy has also resulted in an increase to our social membership. Friday evenings is a popular haunt for parents during the summer, enjoying a drink whilst watching their children enjoying their cricket!

A number of fundraising social events are being planned for 2009 to further enhance our ability to maintain the quality of both the pavilion and ground maintenance equipment. All members are welcome, not just cricketers so please do attend any or all of the events which will be publicised on the cricket club website.

What we need to keep this success going are more members.

ACHIEVE MORE AND MAKE IT HAPPEN IN YOUR VILLAGE WITH NEWBURY COLLEGE

Newbury College Adult learner, Malcolm Hill, has achieved above and beyond anything initially expected from the part time Saddlery course he has attended for over three years.

Throughout the Saddlery course, learners gain the basic techniques to prepare and finish leather for simple repairs or projects. Malcolm has taken this one step further and, as a jockey by profession, decided to embark on making each item of tack he would need for his job. The term tack is used to refer to the equipment worn by the horse for riding or driving and is usually made and supplied by a Saddlery company, so this was an ambitious project to undertake. Malcolm is currently on the home straight of his venture and is completing his final item – a racing saddle.

Jo Houghton, Adult Programme Organiser at the College, recently observed one of the Saddlery classes and commented, "The standard of equipment being produced by the entire class is superb and to produce such high quality work from a part time course is a fantastic achievement. Malcolm Hill is a perfect example of how you can reach for your potential on a part time course and achieve your own, personal goals."

Malcolm Hill particularly chose to study this course for future career development and will endeavour to use his equipment at Alan King's racing yard; other learners on the course simply want to learn the skill for enjoyment.

Malcolm said, "The size of the class allows each learner to have personal feedback from the tutor which is essential when making equipment for live use. The variety of projects set also keeps the learning interesting and allows us to be creative." Newbury College Adult Learning students also celebrated another success earlier on in the year

when the GCSE Spanish class gained 100% pass rate, with 60% A* grades!
