POLICE UPDATE FOR DECEMBER

Here is the latest neighbourhood update for Downlands from Neighbourhood Specialist Officer PC Simon Easton.

The latest ASB and crime figures for the Downlands be viewed can at http://maps.police.uk/view/thames-valley. The facility allows you to view the crime statistics for various types of crime and also allows you to view the statistics for different areas of the force. Crime is down by 13% across the Downlands area when compared to the same three month period at the end of 2008. Many residents have stated that they have noticed an increased police presence in the area this year and I hope that this is directly related to the decrease in crime.

During November, two people were arrested hare coursing; we will continue to respond to reports robustly so please report any sightings that you witness promptly. The offenders often travel across a wide area to carry out these activities and we will continue to collate evidence to link offenders to as many reports as possible.

We have further joint operations planned with officers from Hungerford and Wantage, to tackle and disrupt hare coursing. The operation involves hi-visibility patrols by each neighbourhood team whilst working closely with local landowners. Please be vigilant and report any sightings of such activity immediately to increase our chances of catching the offenders before they leave the area. We are still in the process of liaising with local residents, businesses and parish councils with a view to establishing a Neighbourhood Action

Group (NAG) for the Downlands area. If you are

interested in becoming a member or would like more information about what it involves please contact Police Community Support Officer (PCSO) Dominic Bartlett via the 24-hour Police Enquiry Centre on 0845 8 505 505 or email us using the addresses below.

Our main priority is currently hare coursing as it is still a problem in the Downlands area along the Ridgeway. The areas which appear to be targeted most are the Ilsleys, Catmore, Brightwalton, Farnborough, and Beedon. We are still actively patrolling these areas throughout the day and night with the view of disrupting and preventing any further coursing. However if you have any information or witness such activity please contact us.

PCSO Bartlett has also received reports of antisocial behaviour including under age drinking and littering in some of the local parks across the Downlands. We have been actively targeting this issue in the Leckhampstead area as a priority.

We are also currently reviewing the issue of speeding on Beedon Hill: we are liaising with other agencies such as Road Safety to ascertain the extent of the issue through the results of previous speeding statistics.

PCSO Bartlett and I are working hard to engage with various members of the community, such as businesses, parish councils, residents, local schools, etc. We would very much like to be invited to any meetings, or fetes which you would like us to attend. If so please email myself or PCSO Bartlett via dominic.bartlett@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk or simon.easton@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk. We have arranged a meeting for local landowners and farmworkers regarding the current hare coursing situation which takes place at the Village Hall in Beedon at 7pm on 18 December. We will be actively promoting schemes such as Country Watch at the meeting and informing residents about the appropriate ways to report any suspicious activity. Please contact me if you are interested in attending.

During November, PCSO Bartlett attended a meeting in Leckhampstead to discuss Neighbourhood Watch schemes and give crime prevention advice. The meeting was very successful as residents were able to raise any queries that they had and receive appropriate advice on how to deal with a range of situations. PCSO Bartlett can be contacted to talk to local groups on crime prevention issues, so please email him if this would be beneficial to you.
