OCTOBER NATURE NOTES

9th October

On the verge above Stareveall barn a stonechat uses a dried hogweed stem as a perch from which it sallies forth for insects. Is it a winter visitor, or just passing through?

The beeches opposite the barn have shed a bumper crop of mast. These tasty morsels will make a perfect substitute for pine nuts in a salad.

Claret stained leaves of elder compete for attention with the hips and haws but they are outshone by a spindle bush, whose candy pink berries are beginning to split to reveal the orange seeds within.

12th October 2014

A few blackberries remain on the brambles, they still look inviting but taste insipid. This is a day after the devil was supposedly kicked out of heaven by the archangel Michael and landed in a bramble bush. In trying to extricate himself (I assume he is male?) he got badly scratched and every year on the 11th of October he spoils the berries by urinating on them.

This was the original date of Michaelmas. In 1752 it was moved to the 29th of September. The Abingdon Michaelmas Fair, the longest street fair in Europe, is still held for three days in October. It was originally a medieval hiring fair and it's purpose was to hire farm workers for the coming year. Interestingly this is followed a week later by the much smaller "Runaway Fair", which gave the farm workers an opportunity to "run away" from a bad employer, who had hired them at Michaelmas, and to seek a new job. OCTOBER'S FARMING NEWS

We are now entering a quieter period in our farming diary. All the autumn crops of Winter Wheat, Winter Barley and Winter Oilseed Rape have been planted and are growing well. We are in the middle of spraying the oilseed rape with a mixture of pesticides and nutrients to control the Phoma disease and stimulate root growth. Obviously at present good spraying days are very limited at this time of the year. We have had some slug damage but we are hoping now that the worst is over.

We are loading many lorries at present with Tipple spring barley going to the Coors Brewery at Burton on Trent and the winter wheat, Crusoe and Solstice, is going to the Warburtons' mills around the south of England. The oilseed rape has all left the farm apart from one load.

The cattle are now in the barns being fed haylage and crushed barley and they are a lot happier tucked away out of the wind and rain.

The rams are out with the ewes and tupping has been very quick this year and has almost drawn to a close so we will wait to see the final result in the Spring. Peter Carlisle


Please note any money left over will be 'ring fenced' for future expenditure.
