#### FINDING THE MONEY WEST ILSLEY NEEDS Sean Ryan Chairman of the parish council

A big decision is coming up next month about how to fund the facilities we know and love in West Ilsley — and the parish council wants everyone to have a say. You only have to look at the village hall and the church to get an inkling of how much money's going to be needed. There's also the recreation ground, the tennis court, the play area, the pond, the gazebo and the war memorial, and other commitments besides.

The bills will run into tens of thousands of pounds over the next few years. But the parish council's precept - the part of the council tax that we spend in West IIsley - is only just over £2,500 a year.

So we face a choice as a village. Do we keep relying on the excellent work of relatively few fund-raisers and expect them to pull off one miracle after another? Or do we spread the load by putting up the precept?

At its November meeting, the parish council adopted a proposal which was supported by most of the people who attended. It calls for the precept to be raised by about £1 per household per week. This would provide something like £10,000 a year to be spent wherever it was needed most, on top of the money from fund-raising social events. It

would also allow us to apply for grants on the basis that we could provide matching funds.

We understand that not everyone will welcome the idea of paying £1 a week. But we've kept the precept frozen for seven years and let the various groups and clubs in the village get on with funding themselves. Unfortunately, we don't think we can go on doing this. The scale of the repairs means that far more will be going out than coming in unless we do something about it now. Our precept is smaller than other villages' and we think it's time to put the balance right.

Today marks the start of a debate that will come to a head at next month's parish council meeting. Emails and leaflets will go round with more detail, and we hope that everyone with a view will express it by emailing Alison Banks, the parish secretary, at <u>alison@poplars.org.uk</u> or by writing to her at The Poplars, Main Street. Your views will be taken into account as we finalise our proposals. You'd also be most welcome to attend the meeting where the decision will be taken. It's at 7.30pm in the village hall on January 13.

#### OUR VILLAGE HALL

As villagers of West Ilsley, we are very fortunate to have the many facilities that help to make this village such a special place to live. The Harrow, the Recreation Ground and Cricket Pavilion, All Saints Church and the Village Hall all offer opportunities for villagers to meet and socialise but we would be wrong to take any of them for granted. Without effort and support from the village, each and all of these important meeting places could be at risk. As was reported in the last issue of the WIN, the Village Hall committee has been reformed to decide on 2 key questions.

1) Do we - the village - need and want a Village Hall, or do the other meeting places serve that purpose, rendering the Village Hall unnecessary? It is currently used by the Under 5's, the Table Tennis Club, for Dance Classes and for Birthday parties, as well as for occasional village meetings and social functions - but this is not enough usage to sustain or improve it.

2) If we - the villagers - decide that we would like the Hall to remain open, then how can we improve it as a facility so that it is appealing to more of the community, both within the village and from surrounding areas, making it a sustainable, thriving facility that the village can be proud of and which doesn't impose any sort of financial burden on the village to maintain.

To answer these questions, the Village Hall Committee is asking EVERYONE in the West Ilsley community, to give 10 minutes of their time to answer a questionnaire which will be sent to them by email in the next few days. If you are not on email, we will endeavour to post a copy of the questionnaire through your door. When you receive it, PLEASE give it your earliest attention, as your opinion - positive or negative - is important. These are important decisions, which could result in the closure or the significant improvement of the Hall and it is important that the decision is taken with everyone's true feelings understood.

The Committee is convinced that we can significantly improve the Hall, to make it a friendlier, more welcoming and comfortable social gathering point for young and old alike. We would like the chance to apply for grants that are available to help villages like ours - but we are only prepared to do this if we have the support and enthusiasm of the community we represent. We look forward to receiving your replies to the questionnaire - copies of which will also be available in The Harrow - and to delivering several prizes for the guickest to answer, the most constructive opinions and the best ideas. 


