COUNTRY NOTES

23rd September

The beginning of autumn and a time for foraging. The countryside is full of fruit, hips, haws, blackberries and sloes. There is something very satisfying about harvesting from the wild and perhaps it's the only activity that connects some to the countryside? My favourite is the sloe, the fruit of the blackthorn. The dark blue drupes are extremely sour, a bite of the raw fruit seems to suck all of the moisture out of the mouth. The easiest way to transform the astringent taste into something delicious is to make sloe gin. This is pure alchemy. Tradition has it that the sloes should not be picked until after the first frost but in my experience, if they are ripe, then they are ready. Only take what you need, leave the rest for the birds. There are many recipes, but as with a lot of things in life, the simplest can sometimes be the best. The following is a recipe from the West Ilsley Millennium cookbook, a contribution from Jo Scriven, who in 1999, had not gone metric.

Ingredients

1 1/2 pints Sloes 1 quart Gin

3/4 lb Sugar

2 or 3 drops almond essence

Put all in ingredients in a jar with a stopper. Shake regularly. After 3-4 months (that will be Christmas then) strain the liquid through muslin into a bottle. Keep for as long as you can before drinking.

I keep mine in green bottles as the light will eventually turn the beautiful ruby coloured contents brown. Drink neat as an after dinner liqueur, or put a drop in a champagne flute and top up with sparkling white wine as an aperitif. Best of all put it into a hip flask and pass it around amongst friends on a frosty day. UPDATE FROM THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION -COMPTON, ILSLEYS AND NORREYS BRANCH


