DOWNLANDS MONTHLY UPDATE -FEBRUARY 2011

Here is this month's latest update for the Downlands neighbourhood.

A 49 year old male has been charged with burglary of a dwelling following an offence which took place on 5th January 2011 in East IIsley. This male has been remanded until his court appearance.

Four males from Slough and Maidenhead were arrested following an offence of hare coursing which took place on 31st January 2011 in Brightwalton. All four males have been bailed to allow further police investigations into the offence to continue. Their vehicle was also seized at the time of arrest.

I have received a number of complaints about anti-social riding using motocross bikes on the by-way leading from Brightwalton Holt to Leckhampstead. A motor vehicle is allowed to use by-ways as long as they do not cause any alarm, annoyance or harassment to another member of the public. If a vehicle wishes to use the by-way the vehicle has to be road lega; this means it needs to have visible registration plates, valid insurance, MOT and tax. If you witness a motor vehicle riding on this by-way or any other by-way and it does not meet the above criteria please report it immediately using the nonemergency number. I will also be actively patrolling this area to help deter and detect any offences.

Drink driving is an extremely dangerous and irresponsible offence. If you are attending a public house and will be consuming alcohol please arrange for an alternative way to return home, either book a taxi or designate a friend to

drive but not drink. If you are caught drink driving you will be arrested and will be disqualified from driving.

We are now in the depths of winter and although we have seen a reduction in burglary offences in the neighbourhood so far this winter compared to the previous one we still have criminals that will use any ploy to get into your home. Distraction burglars use crafty techniques to distract people to get into their home so that they can commit a burglary. Distraction burglars are also known as 'bogus visitors', 'bogus callers' or 'con artists'. Please inform elderly members of your community about this advice - unfortunately. elderly people are especially vulnerable to distraction burglary. Keep telephone numbers of utility companies near your front door. Contact your local crime prevention and reduction advisor who can give you a list of reputable local utility companies. Make a note of the Thames Valley Police 24-hour general number - 0845 8 505 505. If someone calls at your door and claims to represent a company, organisation or group, ask to see their identity card. It is also worth calling the company to confirm the visitor's identity. Use the number given in Yellow Pages rather than the number given on the visitor's identity card.

During January I attended Leckhampstead and Peasemore Parish council meetings. It was the first time I have attended Peasemore parish council meeting and met the council. I felt that it was a great opportunity for me to explain how my role works in the community and it was also an opportunity for them and members of public to ask any questions. I have arranged with the council that I will assist them to help set up an active neighbourhood watch scheme for the village to help to prevent and detect crime. If you would like to become involved in this scheme please contact me using the non-emergency number or please email

dominic.bartlett@thamesvalley.pnn.police.uk. Or you may live in another village and do not currently have an active scheme but would like to set one up. Please get in contact and I can provide further details on how best to do so.

Although we are still in the middle of winter and summer is many months away, I am currently organising with villages to attend their summer events such as fetes and fairs. If you would like me to attend any of your village events please contact me using the above details. You can also visit the Thames Valley Police website for further information on dates and times of forthcoming meetings and events.

I am still working hard to promote community messaging and the benefits it has for our community. It is a free service that provides information to subscribers about crime and police activity in their area via phone or email. It also includes information on what we and our partner services are doing to bring offenders to justice or combat anti-social behaviour, and information on opportunities for local residents to raise concerns with their local policing teams. SUNDAY MORNING PRODUCE STALLS David Dawe - Compton Swan

The Compton Swan, situated on the High Street in the centre of Compton is intending to undertake a new initiative for the village and the surrounding villages by making the large car park and garden area available for Sunday morning produce and craft stalls whereby artisans, small holdings and farms from the immediate and surrounding areas can offer their goods for sale. The first market would tie in with the Royal Wedding Celebration weekend - Sunday 1st. May, followed by the 29th May and subsequently on the final

Sunday of each month. The market would be open from 9am to 1pm.

The thought behind the initiative is to bring fresh produce and crafts to a central location, making them available to villagers, who for varying reasons, would not normally have the opportunity to purchase freshly produced local meat, dairy products etc. We intend to make it a family fun event by introducing, for example, a face painter for children and to attract other stall holders who can introduce an element of fun and diversity. Interest has been received to date from a number of stall holders but of course success depends on reaching the wider audience and also potential stall holders whom we may not have informed, or who do not know, of our intent.

Penelope and Jean-Marc, the co-owners, have decided that rather than having pitch fees, the stall holders will be asked to make a charitable donation to the Thames Valley and Chiltern Air Ambulance Trust.
