I was walking the Ridgeway on Monday with my 11 year old son, Michael, and having downloaded all the necessary maps/timetables etc, decided to catch the 4:57 bus from West Ilsley to Didcot. As we walked into the village, I couldn't see the church or bus stop, so asked a lady walking towards me saying I was looking to catch the last bus. She pointed me in the right direction and hoped I caught it as she wasn't sure that the Didcot bus still ran. When I reached the bus stop, I discovered that there was no Didcot bus, so started to look for a taxi number in my rucksack. Before I could call for one, this kind lady pulled up in her car and told me that the buses had stopped running on 1st April, and that she would give us both a lift to Didcot. We arrived at the station and our next bus to Wallingford arrived 5 minutes later. She didn't tell me her name and wouldn't accept petrol money, in the hope that someone might do the same for her one day. It wasn't a life or death situation, we could have easily sorted a cab, but this lady was kind enough to put herself out for me and my son. As she would accept no more than our thanks, then I hope you could add this note to a Parish noticeboard or magazine in the hope that she reads it and knows we were very grateful for her help. Despite all the gadgets the modern world offers (and I was using them all on Monday !), help and kindness still get us to our destination as better people.



But as with the light, the overs were diminishing and the match ended with West Ilsley on 196/8.

Not the best results for the weekend, but all were happy that the season had finally started.
