#### DOWNLAND SPORTS CENTRE

Summer at last!!

Our summer holiday activity programme starts on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> July and runs through the summer until Friday 21st August (10.00 am – 2.30 pm / Monday to Friday). As usual it will be packed with fun and games for children aged between 5 and 11 years and of course, fun in the outdoor pool will be a daily activity (weather permitting!) The programme will be distributed to local schools and if your child has attended the sessions before you will automatically be on our mailing list. If you would like a copy and neither of the above apply

to you please contact us on the number below. The activities are very popular and places limited so please book early to ensure that neither 'you' nor your child is disappointed!

The pool will also be open for public use from Monday 27<sup>th</sup> July until Friday 28<sup>th</sup> August (2.30 – 4.00 pm / Monday – Friday). If you have not been to the Centre before, the pool is an outdoor, heated pool with a shallow end (approx. 3') which graduates to a deep end (approx 6'). It is manned by a qualified lifeguard during opening hours. Children under 8 must be accompanied by an adult. Non swimmers must have an adult in the pool with them at all times who is responsible for their safety.

If you enjoy playing Tennis, please ask about our Tennis Courts which can be booked for use most evenings from 6 – 10 pm (Monday – Friday).

For the young people in the community we offer a Junior Gym session, which includes use of the cardiovascular and resistance equipment. The session will resume on Thursday September 10<sup>th</sup> (3.30 - 4.30 pm) and is for young people aged 11 – 16 and is supervised by a qualified instructor. Places are limited; therefore sessions must be pre-booked and paid for in advance. The sessions are designed to encourage activity, the correct use of the gym ...... and to be fun!

#### POLICE UPDATE

Here is the latest update for the Downlands Neighbourhood from Neighbourhood Specialist Officer, PC Simon Easton

#### June

#### **Crime and Anti-social behavior**

The latest crime figures for the Downlands area can be viewed at

The figures show that recorded crime is significantly lower than at the same time last year, with marked decreases in assaults and anti-social behaviour. There has, however, been a rise in burglaries to sheds, garages and outbuildings (non-dwelling). Please try to ensure that you do not become a victim; make sure you lock your sheds, garages and outhouses.

It is easy to forget crime prevention advice when the summer brings hot weather. Doors and windows left open to let air in are often forgotten and provide an ideal entrance point for potential burglars.

Please do remember to secure your property when you go out, go into the back garden or go to

bed, and bear in mind the premises that surround your home as well: your vigilance may prevent a neighbour becoming a victim of crime.

As part of a new Force initiative, PCSO Bartlett will be conducting follow-up visits and basic home security assessments at any premises that are burgled across the neighbourhood in future. These visits will include any neighbouring properties in order to reduce the chance of other offences occurring.

A 16-year-old boy from Beedon has been charged with harassment and possession of a controlled substance, and will be appearing at West Berkshire Youth Court this month for sentencing. Lee Edwards, 23 from Brightwalton will be appearing at Reading Crown Court this month for sentencing in relation after he pleaded guilty to two house burglaries in the village earlier this year.

#### Partnership activity

We have attended a number of events recently, including a Parish Council meeting in Leckhampstead and the Sheep Fair at East Ilsley. PCSO Bartlett is looking to identify suitable venues, dates and times to hold regular surgeries in each Downlands parish so that local residents can drop in to voice any concerns they have about issues in their area. We will publicise the dates for these as soon as they are confirmed.

#### **Priorities**

We are still in the process of liaising with local residents and Parish Councils with a view to establishing a Neighbourhood Action Group. We will then hold a public consultation to identify the three top priorities to address across the area.

One of the recent priorities for the Hungerford neighbourhood policing team related to harecoursing along the Ridgeway, and this still appears to be a cause for concern in the area and we will address this accordingly.

We are actively conducting police patrols in the area to disrupt any such activity and would encourage all local farmers, landowners and residents to report any incidents that they witness.

# **Future meetings**

We are still in the process of making contact with key groups and members of the community across the area. As part of our engagement plans, PCSO Bartlett and I would like to be notified of any key meetings in the neighbourhood that may be beneficial to our understanding of local concerns.
