WEST ILSLEY STABLES NEWS

Tony Parkes has rejoined us after a few years away, and all of us 'oldies' were glad to welcome a familiar face home.

Our 'babies' as I so unprofessionally insist on calling the two year olds, have been making steady progress learning their craft on the gallops, although it will be a little time yet before they make their racecourse debut. We have a very nice bunch this year, and together with some of the then two-year-olds who shone last summer, we are hopeful of a good season.

The apprentice line up for this year is a little changed, with Chris Cogan returned from a profitable three week work experience in America, and looking fit and keen to go! TENNIS

The court is now open. The problem of moss on the court surface has been investigated and treated with a specialised moss killer and a general purpose weed killer used around the perimeter fence. The net has been repaired and a new handle installed. The broken paving slab on the steps has also been repaired and some of the brickwork rendered over. New perimeter wire has been obtained and a rewiring programme remains to be started. By the way, when retrieving balls going outside the court please go round to collect them and don't pull the wire up from the bottom! Also, cricketers - no shining up the perimeter fence to recapture lofted balls - a key is always available at the Vet's Surgery.

The court fees remain unchanged from last year. £1 per person per hour and children under 16 - 50 pence per hour. Block bookings (i.e. more than 2 consecutive hours) to be agreed by the Management Committee. Whole day bookings are possible also, with prior agreement at a reduced rate of £35 per day. The booking clerk is Elaine Clemenger on 281344 10am - 10pm daily. The gate key should be returned to the vets immediately after playing.
