Dear villagers,

Many of you know that I am now recovering well following a two year period of psychotic depression. I was very unwell, but due to all the friendship, support and help I had from many villagers, family, friends and professionals I have come through to the other side. One of my aims for the future is to encourage everyone to think of their mental health in the same way they would their physical health and also to challenge the stigma and discrimination that goes with it.

World Mental Health Day is promoted by the World Health Organisation and is on Saturday 10th October. It was started 15 years ago and is a way to highlight mental health and wellbeing. It is thought that one in four adults will experience mental health problems at some stage in their life - perhaps you or someone you know has difficulties with their mental health. My journey over the last couple of years has truly been a life changing one, and I would like to be able to give something back and to perhaps help others in this aspect of life.

I would like to invite you to join me in celebrating World Mental Health Day in West IIsley.

The "Five Ways to Wellbeing" (see below) are five simple ways to assist us to either **remain well** mentally or to **help in times of difficulty**. On 10th October there will be a variety of **fun** and **free**

workshops and activities for villagers of all ages. They will follow the themes from the Five Ways of Wellbeing and may help you to *keep well* - activities include: a Tai chi introductory session, storytelling around the pub fire, mindfulness walks, learning about farming and nature, a visit to the racing stables and gallops, and a tea and talk in the village hall.

AUGUST'S FARMING NEWS

The harvest is on hold as we speak due to the lack of summer and much needed sunshine.

Unfortunately, the crops have been ripe and ready for some time and this delay in harvest can cause Malting Barley to deteriorate because it commences germination in the field (Malting Barley has to have 98% germination ability in a sample to qualify for malting). With this wet weather Milling Wheat can also deteriorate to feed wheat as the Hagberg Falling Number drops (this is a reference to the ability of wheat to be able to make bread). Sprouting in the wheat grains in the field reduces this germination.

We have all heard about the ongoing dairy crisis which has resulted in many dairy farms going out of business. Likewise the lamb values are also under huge pressure at present.

To overcome these problems in the livestock industry the NFU (National Farmers Union) are trying to encourage the general public to buy British which I am sure you all are!? Thank you!!

County show aims to put Berkshire on the food map



The launch of Berkshire's signature dish will be a Sunday highlight at the show's cookery theatre

Lancashire has its hot pot. Yorkshire has its pudding. Cornwall has it pasties. Berkshire, on the other hand, has nothing comparable ... yet. But next month's county show is setting out to put that right by inviting local chefs to invent a tasty signature dish that puts Berkshire on the food map of the UK.

The show is inviting restaurant and pub chefs from across the county to take part in a competition to devise a signature dish that Berkshire can at last be proud of. The dish can be a main course, starter or desert. It should include local, seasonal produce

where possible, but it will be for the chefs to decide on the style.

"With top quality ingredients like pork from Berkshire pigs, Red Windsor cheese and beer from local breweries, the chefs will not be short on ideas," says Newbury & District Agricultural Society Chief Executive, Daren Bowyer. "We ask only that the ingredients are fresh and that they are sourced within the county."

He added: "Berkshire is particularly well blessed with good places to eat, from fine dining restaurants through to traditional local pubs. We very much hope that their chefs will pick up the challenge."

The process will involve each chef who registers preparing a sample of his dish for a small group of judges – including John Campbell – who will visit for a tasting ahead of the show. The winner will be notified shortly afterwards and then invited to cook his / her dish at the show on Sunday 20 September 2015, where the official announcement will be made that Berkshire at last has its own signature dish.

Other highlights of this year's two-day show include:

- World-class quad bike stuntman the Kangaroo Kid topping the bill in main arena
- A Shetland Pony Grand National
- Music from the Waterloo Band & Bugles of the Rifles
- Many new 'have a go' opportunities ranging from skateboarding and tractor driving to an inflatable Army assault course
- A Family Trail that takes children on an adventure tour of the showground, learning about farming and food. They can also spin wool, groom donkeys and pan for gold
- Over 2,000 animals competing for a place in the Grand Parade of Livestock
- Old memories revisited in the extended vintage machinery and countryside crafts areas.
- Alongside all of that are all the old favourites that make the Royal County of Berkshire Show a popular end-of-season event for the farming community and, given its extensive crafts and food stalls, an early opportunity to buy early Christmas presents.
