OCTOBER'S FARMING NEWS

Harvest 2016 is now complete and all the winter crops of oilseed rape (Holl – High Oleic Low Linoleic acid), barley (Talisman) and wheat (Crusoe and Skyfall) have been planted. The oilseed rape has been the trickiest crop to establish this autumn due to an abundance of slugs and also Cabbage Stem Flea Beetle being prevalent, both of which severely impair the crop's growth.

We are now trying to keep Blackgrass under control in the growing crops with numerous herbicides which unfortunately have a huge cost attached and are only used where absolutely necessary. The herbicides are constantly losing their efficacy annually due to some resistance creeping in.

The harvested malting barley (Propino) is now leaving the farm and heading to COORS/Souffle at Burton-on-Trent to be used for brewing. Unfortunately, a small amount of Ergot fungus has been detected and this has meant that a couple of loads have had to be screened/cleaned before being accepted.

The Crusoe and Skyfall wheat varieties are now leaving the farm and going directly to mills around the country such as Enfield, Southampton and Avonmouth.

The rams are flirting furiously with the ewes (or viceversa!) and some observers may well have noticed red and green marks on the ewes' bottoms and hopefully many of them will now be in lamb. The lambs born earlier this spring are being sold fat to the abattoir and we hope to retain some for anyone interested in having one for the freezer. Please do let us know.

The cattle are back inside the barn now having had a gorgeous summer in the fields and the majority will be leaving shortly to go to the local abattoir as they are now fully mature. Peter Carlisle

COUNTRY NOTES

Autumn has arrived and with it some glorious leaf colours, the cherry tree by the pond, a fiery orange red, shines like a beacon as you enter the village along the Copperage road. It is already dropping it's leaves but their reds will be followed by the yellows of the field maples. The heavy rain in the middle of the month has encouraged the emergence of a variety of fungi. In the woods there are common puffballs and blewitts along with many others that I can't put a name to. On the verge by the cricket pavilion stand three shaggy ink caps. I forgo the pleasure of eating them so that I can photograph the phases from their emergence as pure white, elongated barrels (the edible phase), next they transform into a delicate bell shape, and then begin to dissolve in their own black ink (a process with the delightful name of deliquescing) leaving just a stem with a small black disc perched jauntily on the top. The inky black fluid, as the names suggests, has been used for writing, it's alternative name is the Lawyers Wig, a reference to the curved white scales which cover the caps

Subject: Bus service 6 - new timetable I am writing as chairman of West Ilsley Parish Council, to enquire about bus service number 6.

The new timetable as from 5 September 2016 drops the West Ilsley, The Harrow stop from the service on two occasions: mid-morning and mid-afternoon.

This impinges on the lives of the people that depend on the bus to get from West Ilsley to Newbury, the very people that

West Berkshire Council aim to help by financially supporting the bus service, typically the elderly who are not fortunate enough to have alternative forms of transport.

While previously it was possible to go into Newbury, returning mid-morning and being home by 11.35, our villagers now have to wait for a return service that only gets them home at 13.35. What looks like a twohourly timetable for other stops, has become a four-hourly service for West

Dropping this stop may save merely eleven minutes off the timetable but it has isolated the village and is a selfdefeating saving: less people will use the bus because the service is less useable. If West Berkshire Council believes that it should spend money supporting a rural bus service, could I ask that someone looks into this. Why should West Ilsley effectively lose its bus service because it happens to be on the end of the route? I look forward to hearing from you, Rollo Duckworth Chairman, West Ilsley Parish Council

Subject: RE: Bus service 6 - new timetable

Mr Duckworth,

Thank you for your email. You will appreciate that the Council has had its budgets reduced, and this has caused a 60% reduction in the supported bus network. As a result, the bus that covers service 6, now also covers a local Newbury service. This has reduced the timetable to every two hours from the previous 90 minute service. Journeys leave West Ilsley for Newbury at 07:32, 09:35 and 13:35, arriving in Newbury approximately 40 minutes later. Return times from Newbury are 08:55, 12:50 and 16:50. People travelling into Newbury on either the 09:35 or 13:35 journeys then have 2½ hours in Newbury before the

We have stopped the alternate buses at East IIsley to allow the service to "catch up" if congestion causes the bus to run late as there is almost no "catch up" time in Newbury. Continuing these journeys to West Ilsley would only allow for 30 minutes in Newbury which seems rather short for people from West Ilsley.

Saying that though, we will be reviewing all of our supported routes over the next few weeks to see how improvements can be made. If there is sufficient time available, we will extend other journeys through to West

I know that some of your residents have also raised this issue, so I am happy for you to circulate my response more widely around West Ilsley.
