FARMING NEWS

The last few weeks have seen almost unprecedented demonstrations by farmers, both at the ports and in the town centres. Unlike our colleagues across the water, we are not by nature militant, and so the extent of the protest shows the degree of difficulty faced by certain sectors of agriculture, and is also a reflection of the frustration felt by the farming community in dealing with an urban orientated administration.

The beef sector is obviously suffering the worst, but all sectors of agriculture are under pressure, mainly due to the high level of the pound, which has a devastating effect on our pricing structure, and in common with many other industries, makes it very difficult to compete on world markets.

Back at grass roots level, things are very wet, but the winter crops look well, and there is no urgent need for any treatment at the moment. The sheep are making quite a mess of the stubble turnips and wasting quite a bit by trampling underfoot, but the crop originally grew well and so supplies should be sufficient for the rest of the winter.
