NEW PLAY AREA FOR WEST ILSLEY?

The village has more and more children, but no longer has a playground. There haven't even been any swings since the equipment next to the Harrow was dismantled. A new group has now been set up by the Parish Council to look at what can be done.

A square of land next to the recreation field is seen as the most suitable place for a Play Area and the Lockinge Estate, which owns it, has said it supports the idea in principle. This possible site has been identified with the help of the Carlisle family. It's in the field beyond the cricket pitch — just to the right of the tennis court as you look up from the Harrow, but screened off from the court by trees.

Full responsibility for the site would rest with the Parish Council, which would take care of insurance and maintenance.

The purpose of this questionnaire is to find out how many people want a Play Area, how many children might use it, what sort of equipment it should have and whether there are any concerns that need to be addressed.

The plan will only go ahead if there's enough support in the village because raising the money for a Play Area will be hard work and finding volunteers to maintain it in good condition is also essential.

The dates for the forthcoming term will then be as follows:





New Technology Helps Fights Crime

Most criminal rely on vehicles to commit crime. Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) is a

policing tool designed to make it far more difficult for them to use vehicles without being detected. In simple terms ANPR consists of cameras connected to a computer. As a vehicle passes, the ANPR equipment



reads the number plate of the vehicle and checks it against sources such as the Police National Computer, DVLA, and Customs and Excise database. If the number plate is matched, for example, with a stolen car, the ANPR equipment will sound an alert so that the car can be stopped. Once alerted, Police officers stop the vehicle concerned...Only vehicles highlighted by enforcement agencies databases will be stopped, so no law-abiding citizen has anything to fear from ANPR operations.

ANPR has many other uses, including tracking and stopping vehicles associated with known suspects.

Schemes using ANPR to combat bilking (leaving without paying) from garage forecourts are also under way.

Trials have shown that an officer using ANPR equipment makes 10 times the arrests of an officer without it. The equipment is mobile, so can be used on any road.

Between April 2004 and March 2005 ANPR operations throughout the Force area generated 1030 arrests, resulted in the recovery of 85 stolen vehicles to the value of approximately 1.25 million pounds and drugs and stolen property to the value of more than ½ million pounds.

The power of the internet has come into its own for West Berkshire twice already this year solving a crime and alerting the public to a major incidents on the M4

Officers in Newbury were trying to trace a mystery man who was shoplifting in Thatcham in December and hoped that someone might recognise the distinctive jacket and logo that the person was wearing when picked up by CCTV.

On 11th January the story was placed on the Thames valley Police website and within 24 hours the story had received more than 700 hits and a positive ID had come from a member of the public. The man was arrested and charged.
