POLICE UPDATE

Downlands Monthly Update - June 2010

Here is the latest update for the Downlands Neighbourhood from Police Community Support Officer Dominic Bartlett. The latest crime statistics for the Neighbourhood can be found at http://maps.police.uk/view/thames-valley. Reports of anti-social behaviour have decreased by 25% when compared to the same period last year. Throughout the summer month's people tend to leave windows and doors open due to the heat. However please be make sure that when you leave your house that the windows and doors are securely locked, as many opportunist burglars will target houses who have left them open. The same also applies for you are likely to be in the rear garden for a prolonged amount of time.

During May a resident of Beedon discovered a vehicle and 3 occupants on their land. They immediately suspected that they could be harecoursing and reported it to the police. The males were challenged and left shortly after. We completed a search for the vehicle around the Beedon and Ilsleys area but did not locate them, however we will be making further enquries as it is still a priority profile for the area.

We are still addressing speeding as a priority in Beedon and other areas. The speed indication device (SID) has proven to be a big success. I have taken it out to Fiddlers Lane in East Ilsley twice in May, and have had noticeable results. The vehicles who were driving over the speed limit will be receiving a letter outlining the implications of speeding. It has also been used in Beedon, with similar results. If you feel there is any area or road which is known for vehicles to speed, please let me know via the following email address below and we will try and bring the SID out with us.

The 24 year old male arrested for the burglary at a farm in Farnborough on 29th April 2010 is still currently on police bail.

Reports of ASB in Leckhampstead have shown a marked reduction as a result of the work carried out to address that priority but we have had some calls reporting problems in Beedon. After receiving numerous reports of anti-social behaviour in Westons, Beedon, I discovered that there was not a current neighbourhood watch scheme down that particular road and I felt that the road would benefit from a scheme such as this. I have since visited all the houses and have had a very positive response, and am in the current process of setting one up. The same is currently being done for Nuttingtons in Leckhampstead. I will be hoping to

identify more roads across the downlands area who do not have a current scheme, with the aim of setting more up. If you would like more information on such schemes please email myself or email Debbie Morton at

In the forthcoming months I am hoping to start a crime prevention scheme known as Virtually Stolen. It involves identifying vehicles which have valuable items such as sat navs left in the vehicle. If a vehicle is identified with having an item left on show, the owner of the vehicle will be sent a letter, advising them of the danger of doing so. I will be hopefully targeting car parks of premises such as public houses, village halls, and anywhere there is likely to be a number of cars. So please do not be alarmed if you see me looking around your vehicle.

We are still in the process of liaising with local residents, businesses and parish councils with a view to establishing a Neighbourhood Action Group (NAG) for the Downlands area if viable. Every week we provide a craft such as painting, play dough and sticking, and special themed activities throughout the year.


We provide drinks and snacks for the children, and tea and coffee for the adults. The session ends with circle time sing song.
