Aldworth's village shop and Post Office closed six years ago. Just two weeks later villagers started up volunteer-run "Saturday Stalls". continue, every Saturday morning, in Aldworth Village Hall where we meet up for a sociable "Shop and Chat".

We have a Tea Bar and sell a large variety of fresh fruit and vegetables, homemade cakes, pies and biscuits, local eggs and honey, Fairtrade groceries, local plants and flowers (in season), sweets, postage stamps, books and pre-ordered bread (Sheppards') and newspapers.
