

MALTHOUSE WELL

As expected the Malthouse well readings have fallen steadily over the summer and at the end of November the groundwater level is now around 17.3 metres (56.8ft) below ground level.

Interestingly there was no effect on the groundwater level following the flash flood we had after the tremendous thunderstorm in the early hours of 9^{th} September when an astonishing 70+mm rain fell in just a few hours. Other than that our September

rainfall was pretty average, and this was followed by one of the driest Octobers in the last 50 years. However, November has been average and so the groundwater level is still dropping by around 150mm (6 inches) per week at the moment.

COUNTRY NOTES

November 2016

It has been a particularly colourful autumn but the mid month gales have done their best to strip the trees of their leaves. Some cling on longer than others, particularly in the hedgerows where bright yellow elm leaves still provide a splash of colour. These hedgerow elms are remnants of the once magnificent trees that for millennia graced and defined the southern English landscape, the landscape of my childhood. They stood in rows in every hedgerow, and as specimen trees thirty metres tall in the middle of fields, elms were as quintessentially English as the oak. Their branches the home of rooks, the hollow

trunks housed nests of jackdaws, owls and stock

doves. Their twisted, close grained timber, provided seats for chairs, stocks for cart wheels, water pipes the Romans. planks for coffins, piles to raise Venice above the mud of it's lagoon and foundations for the Old London Bridge that resisted the



Thames tides for 600 years. Ravaged by Dutch Elm disease in the nineteen seventies, thirty million died, changing the landscape for ever. But some retained the ability to propagate themselves from root suckers and these are the ones that still appear in the hedgerows, they will live for around fifteen years reaching a size when they will attract the attentions of the elm bark beetle which will "infect" the tree with the deadly Dutch elm fungus which will "strangle" the tree to death.

250 PEOPLE ATTEND REMEMBRANCE IN COMPTON 13TH NOVEMBER 2016



The Compton, Ilsleys & Norreys Branch of the Royal British Legion (RBL) this year held its Remembrance Sunday parade and service in Compton on a bright, cold and sunny morning. The branch rotates the event, on an annual basis, around its catchment downland villages.

Those parading, RBL members, Youth Groups and supporters, assembled in the Compton Swan car park under the direction of the Parade Marshal and Branch Chairman Mr Steve Allison, and then marched to the church led by Pipe Major Ian Knight and RBL branch standard bearer Mike Crockford.

The service started around the War Memorial located in the church grounds, led by the branch chaplain Rev Clive Jones. The Exhortation was spoken by Mr Julian Jeffs and the Kohima Epitaph by Mr Peter Whitworth. The names of the fallen were read out by the branch secretary, Mr David Norbury TD. A two minute silence was observed at 11 o'clock with the Last Post and Reveille being played by trumpeter Miss Aimee Jones. Wreaths were then laid on behalf of the RBL by branch member Mick Hall. Further wreaths were laid by representatives of local parish councils and youth groups.

The service continued inside the church with the lesson being read by County Councillor Virginia Von

Celsing and address being given by the Rev Clive Jones. The event was very well attended with many of the congregation having to stand – an estimated 250 people. After the service the parade reformed to return to the Compton Swan via the new plaque under the village notice board commemorating the centenary anniversary of the Battle of the Somme where Parish Council member lan Tong laid a wreath. Next year, the branch's parade and service will be held in Hampstead Norreys

The officers of the branch would like to thank all those who supported this successful event and to thank villagers in all our downland catchment villages for contributing so generously to the Poppy Appeal this year by wearing their poppies with pride. Our Poppy Appeal Organisers (PAO's) in each village work tirelessly to collect as much as possible for this charity and the branch thanks them very much. We will report the total collected from our area in my next update.

Finally, and not least, the branch would like to compliment those in our youth groups and their leaders for attending our Remembrance event in such numbers and for being so very smartly turned out - you can rightly be proud of yourselves.

And as always a recruiting note - do come and join us! You do not have to be ex services (or a senior citizen!) to join the RBL but only supportive of the charity's objectives of looking after the serving and excommunity. West Berkshire Council Sandbag Policy

- 1. This document sets out West Berkshire Council's policy regarding the supply of sandbags during an emergency flood event.
- 2. Householders and business owners are responsible for protecting their own property. **West Berkshire Council does not have a statutory duty to provide sandbags** nor is it our policy to do so. However, the Council does have permissive powers in relation to flood defense and maintains a limited supply of sandbags for use to primarily to protect vulnerable residents (residents who as a result of age, disability or illness they are unable to take protective actions to safeguard themselves or their property). During a severe flood event, we will not be able to meet every request for sandbags, however we will handle all enquires sympathetically but in strict accordance with the following priorities:
- a. To prevent loss of life or serious injury (supply and placement, subject to health and safety considerations)
- b. To maintain access for emergency services (supply and placement)
- c. To protect vital facilities within the community e.g. care homes, schools, surgeries (supply only)
- d. To protect Council buildings (supply and placement)
- e. To safeguard vulnerable individuals (supply and placement)
- f. To support local partners (supply only and recharge costs)
- 3. The Council will consider providing help to residents who are in imminent danger of flooding where resources allow. However, we will not supply sandbags as a precautionary measure based on forecasts. Requests from commercial premises owners will only be considered in very exceptional circumstances and a charge will be made for any assistance that is given.
- 4. Where sandbags are provided the following conditions apply:
 - a. No guarantee can be given that sandbags will be delivered within a specific timescale.
 - b. The council will not accept responsibility for the quality or effectiveness of sandbags provided by the council.
 - c. All requests for sandbags will be assessed in terms of the health and safety of the crews making deliveries and the availability of personnel to produce sandbags.
 - d. Members of the public will not be allowed to collect sandbags from the council's depot.
 - e. We will supply sandbags free of charge on a needs basis. However, once issued the sandbags are deemed to become the property of the householder or receiving organization. West Berkshire Council will not accept responsibility for the collection and disposal of sandbags although exceptions will be considered where householders are elderly or disabled.
 - f. Sandbags will not be provided to protect gardens, garages or other outbuildings
- 5. The Council will encourage people to make their own enquires for sandbags in advance of a flood event by contacting local suppliers such as builders merchants where they can purchase them or possibly have them delivered.
- 6. The Council will continue to support and encourage householders and businesses to develop flood action plans to prepare in advance of flood emergencies and flood warnings.
