

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH Fred Carter

Distraction Burglars - often known as bogus

callers – are responsible for a distressing crime often aimed at the more vulnerable members of society. These people's actions can have serious consequences on the quality of life of many victims.



They will use every trick known to get into peoples houses and rifle through their possessions – taking everything of value that they can find.

Bogus callers can appear to be very credible. They may claim to be utility workers, council officials or even Police officers. They are particularly persuasive and articulate and can easily talk there way into peoples homes.

Current research shows that older people are their main target.

How can I stop them?

There are a few simple steps you can take to keep bogus callers out and prevent yourself being taken in by their act.

When answering the door **STOP** and think, are you expecting anybody.

CHAIN – put this on before opening the door, this will enable you to keep control of the situation.

CHECK – ask for their identification card, take it and look at it carefully. Close the door and call any organisation involved if you are not sure. Find the numbers you need on your last bill or in the telephone book.

If you are in any doubt don't let them in. If you have refused to let them in and they don't go away, call the Police.

Remember

Try not to keep lots of cash in the house and keep things like your pension book, savings book, cheque book and cards well hidden.

Most utilities and service staff will make an appointment prior to coming to your house and should not turn up unannounced. If somebody unexpected, who you don't know comes to your house do not let them in until you are absolutely sure they are genuine. If you have concerns about a suspicious caller please contact the Police, even if the caller has left your house, as they may be calling on other houses in the area. This includes unannounced callers who claim to be carrying out property repairs. Note down a description of them, and note any registration number of any vehicle or vehicles being used.

Suspicious callers

If someone suspicious calls at your home, even if you do not let them in, **telephone the Police on 08458 505505 immediately.** Your information could be vital In stopping a crime.

If you feel you are in any danger ring 999 – it is an emergency if a crime is being committed or is about to be committed or if there is a risk of serious injury.

He wanted to go inside the house to complete a survey. The home owner checked with Thames Water and found there was no such survey

WIN WALKS walking in the neighbourhood Fred Carter




Two circular walks starting from Aldworth....4½ or 6½ miles (Map O/S Explorer 158).

A chance to visit St Mary's Church and see the famous "Aldworth giants".

House and walk towards the church. Just beyond the churchyard turn right along a track. Now ignore a path on the left and continue past Dunworth Farm. Just after the farm the track bears right and soon you are heading for the Downs: on reaching a T junction turn left along a lane. After 250 yards, turn right, downhill along a track signed Warren Farm. At a track junction bear left along the main track and continue until you reach a T junction. Turn right along the Ridgeway following it as it gradually descends towards Streatley. After about a mile you will reach the entrance to Warren Farm, Here the Ridgeway becomes metalled, continue ahead for another ½ mile then look for a house on the right called 'Wynders'. Just past the house turn right along a footpath. Level at first the path starts to ascend gradually between hedgerows then through open fields. At Kiddington Cottage bear left around the front of the cottage and follow the path uphill through Westridge Copse to join the B4009.

The shorter walk turns right here. Follow the road through Westridge Green to reach a sharp left hand bend. Here go straight ahead, passing a post box on the left. After passing the last house on the left the track becomes gravelled: after 200 yards turn left along a path across the middle of a field. At the far side go over a cross track, through a gap in the hedge, and bear left across the next field. At the far corner continue along an enclosed path to reach a road. Turn right to return to the Bell Inn.

The longer walk turns left here, then after about 100 yards, turns right down a metalled track. Where the metalled track turns left towards Gould Cottage, go straight ahead along an ascending track between hedgerows. Where the track turns right into a field carry straight on through a narrow strip of woodland. The path bears right, crosses a small opening and then ascends through College Wood. At the top go through a barrier and bear right to reach a footpath junction. Here turn right along a bridleway following it to reach a road. Turn right along the road for 700 yards (ignoring the footpath on your right hand side) to reach a road junction. (Reading Road) Turn right along the road signed for Aldworth and after 700 yards turn left along a metalled road going diagonally left, go past the houses on the left (Fayleys Farm) to reach the B4009 turn left then almost immediately right to return to Aldworth.

Excerpts from Parish Council meeting

1. <u>Guest Speakers</u> –

Peter Atkinson and Martyn Scott from The Rotary club speaking on behalf of the Life Education Centres available to local schools. The Chair thanked them very much for their time and we shall follow up with our support to our catchment school-The IIsleys.

2. <u>Matters arising</u>

It was noted that tree surgery to the Horse Chestnut overhanging Main Street had taken place. Thanks had been sent to John Summerhill.

The precept request had been sent off to WBC.

3. <u>Correspondence received</u>

Letter received from Geoff Pike requesting we all get together to sign the New Trust Deed. The Clerk to invite him to the next meeting.

MoU received from the Cricket Club, which will be reviewed in May when they report to the Council. It was noted that they are not willing to maintain the ditch. The Clerk to reply and ask if they are willing to maintain the ditch for a fee.

Letter received back from Neil Stacey at WBC re our questions concerning the new 7.5 tonne weight restriction sign off the A34 by the turnoff to Beedon, the movement of the 30mph sign and the speeding through the village. Despite our challenges we have again been unsuccessful. The Council propose to approach the matter another way and The Clerk will write to Mick Channon and Alan Dunkerton (road safety team) to obtain their support with respect to road and horse safety.

4. <u>Reports from the working parties</u>

The Play Ground working group.

The group has received provisional costings for a range of play area equipment ranging from £10k minimum to develop the proposed site to £5 approx for a smaller set of equipment in a site in the far corner of the Recreation ground. Grants, funding and insurance issues will be investigated next.

5. <u>Guest Speaker for the Parish Assembly</u>

The Clerk to approach Dr Lowenthal of the Downland practice, followed by The Police and then the Rotary

Club or Air Ambulance. The Annual Parish Assembly date was set as Monday 24th April at 7pm and the PC meeting for Monday 8th May. The Clerk to invite the Committees to attend the assembly and to advertise the evening in WIN.

6. <u>New Parish Councillors (to replace Paul</u> and Lynne Smith)

It was confirmed that we may co-opt members to join (rather than elected) so The Clerk will advertise the vacancies. The Clerk to remove Lynne Smith as a bank signatory.

7. Open Forum

Fred Carter had offered to look into the history of West IIsley and walks around West IIsley. All were in favour of this and the PC offered their support.

The Chairman declared the meeting closed at 9pm
