#### **UPDATE FROM COUNCILLOR CAROLYNE CULVER** Dear residents, I hope all is well with you.

I've recently been able to secure another £5,000 in match funding for community projects in Ridgeway ward via the council's Member's Community Bids scheme. This year's successful projects include £1,100 for West Ilsley village hall. This is in addition to the £2,000 secured for the village hall the previous year using the same scheme.

Following the recent parish council meeting I reported the uncut roadsides on Bury Lane to WBC.

I visited the Downs School to speak to the head teacher and business manager about the ongoing problems of parking and congestion when parents are dropping off or collecting students. They have shared their traffic management plan with me, we discussed the options that they have already looked at, and what we might be able to do in the future.

At Executive in July we discussed adult social care and I raised concerns about the lack of respite care available to unpaid carers, and the lack of adapted accommodation suitable for the elderly. At Full Council on 19 July my group proposed two motions: one about fair taxation, and one calling upon the council to write to the government to oppose the deportation of asylum seekers to Rwanda. We believe we should be offering support to asylum seekers and treat them with dignity. We have given a warm welcome to people fleeing conflict in Ukraine. West Berkshire is in the top five local authorities in the country for the number of people who have volunteered to host Ukrainians.

Don't forget that you can report problems including fly tipping, unemptied bins, and pot holes by searching for 'West Berkshire Report a Problem' on the internet or visiting <u>www.fixmystreet.com</u> Alternatively, email <u>customerservices@westberks.gov.uk</u> or call 01635 551111. If you don't get a satisfactory response let me know. For information about road works (eg utility companies digging up roads) please look at One Network <u>https://uk.one.network</u> which contains a map where you can search for details of what is happening in the area.

We all know from the news and personal experience that the price of food, fuel and household bills is rising and will continue to do so. I am discussing with local residents, who volunteered to support the community during the lockdowns, how we can work together again to make sure people know what help is available during these challenging times.

West Berkshire Food Bank provides emergency food to local people.
