There is a new website <u>www.police.uk</u>, set up by the government to allow members of the public to view the crime figures for the area or road they live in. It is a useful website as it not only provides you with crime figures but allows you to see who your current neighbourhood police team are, and how to contact them but also has advice on crime prevention.

Back in January 4 males were arrested following a report of hare coursing in Brightwalton, and were pursued by police to Compton. The four males have now been charged with the offence of criminal damage to crops whilst hare coursing.

A man from Abingdon was arrested during March for carrying a 7 inch hunting knife whilst he was at Bury Down car park in West Ilsley. He was later charged for carrying a bladed article in public.

One of our main priorities in the Downlands is to tackle hare coursing. Throughout February and March we have received very few reports of hare coursing in the Downlands neighbourhood which is very reassuring. However, as the weather is improving and the nights are becoming longer it may encourage people to commit this offence. If you witness any person/s who you believe to be hare coursing or have any information about such activity please report immediately using the nonemergency number. Since the start of 2011 we have received 2 reports of raves or large parties happening at the under bridge along the Ridgeway near to Bury Down car park in West Ilsley. Raves are illegal and cause noise problems for local residents, and will often leave a large amount of litter behind. If you witness, or suspect people using this location for the purposes of a rave please report it immediately as we will have more chance of tackling the event and preventing any further offences.

Throughout March we have received a small number of reports of distraction burglaries across West Berkshire. Although we have not suffered any in the Downlands neighbourhood, I would like to take this opportunity to provide some advice on bogus callers and distraction burglars. A bogus caller or distraction burglar is someone who calls at your house posing as officials or asking for your help with something. They often make up a story to enter your house with the intention to steal. Some work alone but often they work in groups of two or three; usually one person will knock at your door, with a convincing excuse. If you are not expecting someone either use your door chain before opening or speak to them from an upstairs window; never let them in if you are unsure. If they are genuine they will happily wait outside for you to check on them by calling their organisation. If you do have someone calling at your house and you feel they are not genuine, report it to us immediately.

During March I attended Beedon's parish council meeting to answer any questions or concerns that the council or a member of the public may have had. The main concern which was raised was speeding vehicles along the Beedon straight. I have advised them that as part of the neighbourhood team I will raise this with my colleagues and endeavour to try and conduct speed checks. I also attended East Ilsley's parish council meeting and answered any questions. It was a nice opportunity for me to meet the community and for them to meet me. And I have been into visit the year 5 pupils at The Ilsleys primary school to provide a talk on personal safety.

Unfortunately I will not be attending any groups or meetings during April, as I will be resigning from

the position of Police Community Support Officer for the Downlands neighbourhood.

I am still working hard to promote community messaging and the benefits it has for our community. It is a free service that provides information to subscribers about crime and police activity in their area via phone or email. It also includes information on what we and our partner services are doing to bring offenders to justice or combat anti-social behaviour, and information on opportunities for local residents to raise concerns with their local policing teams. 
