PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

A well-attended parish assembly on May 18 heard reports from the numerous groups that make West IIsley such a vibrant village, with cricket, tennis and table tennis represented alongside the village hall, the church and everyone from the Youth Club to the Evergreens.

In my report on the parish council's activities, I thanked all the councillors for helping to foster

community spirit as well as looking after their own projects: Dries Hagen for his rota of volunteers to look after the church yard and other work which has made a visible difference to the village; Alan Bloor for tenaciously pursuing West Berkshire Council to make sure it fulfils its obligations to us, particularly on the risk of flooding; John Mountford for his persistence on transport matters, especially speeding and threats to our bus service; Fred Carter for publishing a list of all the societies and activities in the village, which has been so useful to newcomers; Sue Simmons for the work she put in as treasurer over the past year; and Jo Scriven who has taken over that post for the year ahead

The main issues that preoccupied us in the last 12 months were:

SPEEDING. A vehicle activated sign was installed on Main St by West Berkshire council at the request of Cllr George Chandler and ourselves to remind anyone doing more than 30mph to slow down. According to the police, who came along to one of our meetings, one-third of the cars travelling through West Ilsley exceed the speed limit and in two separate rounds of monitoring, two cars were caught doing more than 50mph and four were found to be doing more than 40mph. The police warned they would be back!

FLOODING. Following the flood of July, 2007, various pieces of work were undertaken to reduce the risks to the village and this programme has continued. Although the system is not perfect, gulleys have been redug in Catmore Road, a drainage pipe has been replaced near the old veterinary surgery, new soakaways in Bury Lane have been found to be working well and most drains have been fairly regularly cleaned out. West Berks still has some way to go but water seems to be draining away better on the whole than it used to.

TENNIS. The parish council held a joint meeting with the old tennis committee last autumn. This resulted in the formation of a new committee under Andy Driver which has already proved a dynamic force for change. It also led to the clearance of trees from one side of the court where they were interfering with the light to neighbouring homes. The resurgence of interest

in tennis means that it is now played by nearly 90 people in the village.

PLAY AREA. The first full year of the play area, which we built the previous year with lottery money, has been a great success. It has not only proved popular but has been well looked after by a rota of parents and has just passed its annual safety inspection with flying colours. Some who opposed this project at the outset have made a point of saying how glad they are now that it went ahead.

PARISH PLAN. We heard talks from Sarah Ward of West Berks Community Action and from Neil Sanderson, who oversaw a parish plan at Peasemore, on how to set the process in motion. A group is now being formed in West Ilsley to put together a plan in the next year or so in response to a questionnaire that will be dropped into every household to find out what you'd like to see happen here. This will be done independently of the parish council and will look at all kinds of things from housing needs to use of the recreation ground and the possibility of restoring allotments to the village.

CHURCH WAY road surface. West Berks Council has agreed to provide free material, such as gravel or scalpings, if the residents pay to have it laid. At the time of writing, Ian Fewtrell-Smith was negotiating the quantity with them in the hope that this could be sorted out soon.

PRECEPT. Mindful that this is no time to be imposing any unnecessary financial burden on anyone, the parish council froze the precept - part of the council tax - for the third year running.

It's been good to see another increase in attendance at parish council meetings. The more people who come along, the more ideas we get and the more chance we have of putting them into practice!

Village CAMP OUT & BBQ

The Village Hall Committee are pleased to announce that the annual Village Camp Out will take place on Saturday June 13th (from 3pm) and extend through to Sunday 14th (10am).

It will be centred round the camp, with an optional walk up or bike ride from the village starting at 3pm, a camp tea at 5pm and a family BBQ at about 7pm, followed by a camp sleep over.

The aim of the Camp Out is to invite all West Ilsley villagers and ex villagers to enjoy a camp out together and for all ages to mix and socialise. Details as follows:

Part 1 - Saturday afternoon 3-5pm

Adventure walk from the village, leaving from The Poplars garden at 3pm for children and adults. Those aged over 5 years old can be left with us. This walk will be led by volunteers (Amanda Knight - 281609) from the village and any adults interested in leading or joining in on the walk please let us know. We should arrive at the camp by 4.30pm to start preparing the fire for tea.

OR

An adventure mountain bike ride up to the camp site, starting from The Cart Track (by The Malthouse at 3pm), via the Ridgeway to the camp. This will be approximately 7miles long and we suggest for 7+ children competent on their bikes. Parents are welcome to accompany, but not necessary. This ride will be led by Andy Carrington - 281354. Depending on the numbers we may like some parents to assist.

Please bring your own drink, hat/cycle helmet and sun cream (or raincoat) for the above activities.

To conclude the afternoon at 5pm approximately, hot dog tea and marshmallows for all cooked on the fire.

Part 2 - Saturday 6pm to Sunday 10am

From 6pm the camp is prepared for the night and for those children staying a responsible adult should arrive. Tents are put up then and we encourage this as a family activity! We then enjoy a family BBQ supper in the evening (from 7pm approx).

The next day, we cook breakfast, take down the camp, clean and tidy up. Finish 10am Sunday.

Open to all West IIsley children and ex west IIsley children of any age.

Part 1, all children from 5yrs can be left, but helpers welcome.

Part 2, a responsible parent/adult/volunteer to accompany (on a ratio of no more than 4 kids to 1 adult),

help out and sleep over from 6pm to 10am.

The camp site is located 1 mile outside West Ilsley. Take the Catmore Road out of the village and after the first s bend. turn right through the gate before the second s bend. Park along the track on the LHS. The site is lent to us as a small campsite for tents and thanks go to Lockinge Estate and to Peter Carlisle who allow us to do this

All food and drink is included for Part 1. For Part 2 please bring your own supper. We shall have a BBQ fire going so we suggest you bring something to cook and your own refreshments. Juice and water will be available throughout plus tea/coffee, sugar, milk, cereal, bacon, bread and jam for the morning. Please bring anything else you wish to eat or drink.

There will be a charge this year (£10 per tent), and we do require your signed booking form in advance if you are leaving your children and to help us know who is coming. Without this we cannot accept them. The weekend will go ahead whatever the weather!!

To join in, wear appropriate old clothing that you don't mind getting dirty or torn. For Part 2, the following kit is required.

- Tent for you and your child/ren.
- Thick sleeping bag/duvet and Sleeping mat (optional)
- Waterproof top and trousers, thick wool jumper or fleece
- Spare warm trousers, socks and long sleeved shirt
- Warm hat/gloves and good shoes or boots
- Torch, Plastic mug, plate & bowl plus cutlery for you.
- Do not bring anything electrical, any money or excessive sweets.

We hope this provides a great event for all ages and we look forward to hearing from you.

WORK SKILLS PROJECT IN WEST BERKSHIRE

Link Up is a work skills project for Adults with Learning Disabilities based in The Slater Centre on New Greenham Park. It was established in 1995 and is a partnership between West Berkshire Mencap, Newbury College and West Berkshire Council. It provides valuable work skills training for up to 30 trainees a day, who are supported by trained staff in a work shop environment. Link Up is a non-profit making organization with all money goes back into funding the project.

Service users are able to gain qualifications through Asdan and NOCN nationally accredited awards covering a wide range of skills including understanding basic Health & Safety and ICT basics.

The work we do is all real work for mainly local businesses with a notable exception being a bookmark company based in Yorkshire.

Work ranges from mail shots to light assembly & packaging and making up tasselled bookmarks including counting, packaging, bar-coding and despatching. We also have a small shrink wrap facility used to wrap anything from emergency blankets to student study packs.

With our numbers approaching 90 service users per week we are always on the lookout for work so please do contact us if you feel we might be able to help.

As part of our commitment to providing the opportunity to experience work we have a Jobcoach programme that seeks to match up service users with local work opportunities. This enables them to participate in taster sessions and if successful enjoy a work placement. At the moment we have placements ranging from working as a shop assistant in Budgens and Tadley Pet Supplies to working at the Library and being a chambermaid at Donnington Valley Hotel. Other placements include working with 'Help the Aged' to delivering hot meals as part of the 'Meals on Wheels' programme.

The vast majority of placements are supported either by a jobcoach or a trained volunteer who provide support and guidance to the individual and act as the link with the local business.

To enable the job coaching programme to develop further we rely on the kind generosity of our highly respected volunteers. They give between two and four hours per weeks enabling service users to play a more active and fulfilling role in society. For this reason all our volunteers are CRB checked and given free training including First Aid. Travel expenses are paid and a full support structure is available. Currently the demand from service users for placements is such that we desperately need more volunteers and would welcome offers from those of you who feel you would like to contribute to this rewarding work allowing those less fortunate to play a more inclusive role in society.


