APRIL'S FARMING NEWS

The ewes and lambs are happily grazing the pasture at the moment although it is still cold for the time of year. The lambs have just been drenched orally with Endoworm and this controls Roundworm, Lungworm and Tapeworm. They have also been treated with Vecoxan for coccidial (parasitic disease) worm infection which spreads from one animal to another through contact with infected faeces. As you may have spotted, we also have a few additional mini Welsh Black ewes and lambs that have happily joined the rest of the flock of Greyface Mule, Suffolk and Texel ewes.

The ewe lambs (one year old ewes) that were put in lamb last December are due to give birth in early May and are now very close to lambing. They will soon be moved to Folly Meadow in order that they can be brought inside at night to lamb.

The ongoing spray programme on the cereal and oilseed rape crops is progressing. The last spray on Winter Wheat has just been completed which was predominantly for growth regulation and disease control i.e. Septoria, Brown Rust and Mildew prevention. Septoria is a relatively big issue this year

as a result of the wet weather. Within this spray application trace elements are included e.g. copper, zinc and magnesium.

The Oilseed Rape is starting to come in to flower and will be sprayed when in full flower to protect the crop from the diseases of Sclerotinia, Alternaria and Botritis. With this application there will be folia nitrogen with the trace elements Boron and Magnesium.

We are looking forward to some warmer, sunnier weather at the start of May which the ewe lambs will appreciate having recently been shorn.


She loved her Bingo & crosswords and very much enjoyed the West Ilsley evergreens.

MALTHOUSE WELL

At the end of April the groundwater level has risen to 9.71 metres (31.9 feet) below ground level, and this will be the peak level for this winter season. This is

just above the 9.9 metres (32.6 feet) reached in March The Ridgeway Down borehole (http://www.gaugemap.co.uk/#!Detail/11039) at the top of our valley reached its peak on 16 April and so the Malthouse well reading should follow suit and start its summer fall in the next few days.

fit the trips made each week. Some volunteers are Handybus and car drivers.


What else is involved: You volunteer your time and we pay your mileage expenses. Residents in the Downland community, who are otherwise unable to get to medical appointments, value your help In
