MONTHLY UPDATE -

DECEMBER 2010

Here is the latest update for the Downlands Neighbourhood from Police Community Support Officer Dominic Bartlett. The latest crime statistics Neighbourhood can be at [http://maps.police.uk/view/thames-valley]. The neighbourhood has seen a 12.5 per cent decrease in all crime compared to the same three month period last year (August-October). Robbery has seen the largest decrease of 35 per cent, closely followed by burglaries which has decreased by 31 per cent. We are still working hard to provide security advice and crime prevention advice to help reduce such crimes, and actively patrolling to prevent any criminal activity. I am pleased to say that reports of anti-social behaviour (ASB) have decreased during this period by 27.6 per cent, and we are actively patrolling hot spot areas.

A 26 year old male from Burghfield was arrested during November following an incident in West Ilsley. The male had reportedly caused damage to crops and when confronted by a local gamekeeper became threatening and abusive. The male was issued with a harassment warning. Throughout November we have received numerous calls about hare coursing. There have been reports across West Ilsley, Chaddleworth and Peasemore. All reports were quickly attended by police units who completed a through search for the offenders and intelligence reports have been submitted reference persons and vehicles neighbourhood involved. The team conducted a joint operation with the Hungerford and Wantage teams across a weekend in November to tackle hare coursing. Across the weekend we responded to reports of coursing across the 3 areas. Although no arrests were made, persons and vehicles were stopped and details taken. If you witness hare coursing or see suspicious activity please do not hesitate to report it to us.

Following on from the above, there has also been a small spate of garages and outbuildings which have been broken into across the Downlands neighbourhood. Please make sure that your garages and outbuildings are securely locked, and do not leave tools and ladders out as these can be used to break into your house. You can also secure valuable items such as bicycles, lawn mowers and power tools to a strong anchor point inside your garage/shed. Some of you may have heard of our rural text alert but for those of you who haven't I will quickly explain. During 2009 we decided to create a text alert system to help combat rural crime such as hare coursing. It is a system we use where by if we receive a report of coursing we send the vehicle details and incident details out via text message. It has been very successful and we have received excellent feedback from those who receive the messages. I also visited Beedon's and West Ilsley's stay and play groups for parents and toddlers. In December I am hoping to visit East Ilsley's coffee morning as I have unfortunately not been able to visit for while.
