COUNTRY NOTES

January

After one of the warmest Decembers on record the temperature dropped to minus five degrees in mid January. This hasn't deterred the mistle thrush. A male is currently proclaiming his territory behind The Harrow hoping to attract a mate. He needs to get on with it as the nest is often built and a clutch of eggs laid as early as February. His song is loud and similar to that of a blackbird although in shorter bursts. It is often delivered from the top of a tree, even in high winds, which accounts for it's local name of stormcock. It also has an aggressive rattling call when agitated and this is often directed at cats, the birds will defend their nests against all comers. This aggressive behaviour is also used in winter to guard a food source, such as the holly tree, driving off rivals to keep the berries for it's self. The bird is particularly fond of berries and it's liking for mistletoe berries gives it it's name. Perdix




*Café Church

ST PATRICK'S CHURCH EAST ILSLEY

Things have been a bit busy recently at St Patrick's. Now that the new facilities are in place, we are finding – as we hoped – that more are coming on Sunday mornings to the 11.15am Mass. I think the secrets of our modest success are attributable (in no particular order) to: a convenient time; a decent loo; the new St Michael's room, and people's general anxieties about life.

With success come certain problems: Stanmore Road is not the easiest or most convenient place to park. Wanting to be good neighbours, we have asked people, where possible, to park on the main road. Also, a congregation of nearly forty, up to a quarter of whom are infants or toddlers, and nearly as many of primary age, means that people have different agendas and needs at Mass. We are looking into arranging things so that, for the first part of Mass, children can go into the St Michael's Room and learn in an age-appropriate way. Then, in the second part of Mass, where parents are at present having to tiptoe out with noisy toddlers, we hope to arrange closecircuit television, so that no one has to miss the action of the Mass. The other half of the congregation – men and women without family with them - are delighted that our little church is full and lively but they too will benefit if everything is available for everyone in an age-appropriate way. Part of the secret of good church life is to build community, and we are trying to

do that by having coffee and cake after Mass on the first Sunday in the month.



MALTHOUSE WELL

As predicted the Malthouse Well water level started to rise in January. During the month it rose about 2.5 metres (8ft 2ins) from its seasonal low point at the end of December and now stands at approximately 17.5 metres (57ft 5 ins) below ground level. This is about 5.5 metres (18ft) lower than this time last year and is way below the critical level for the village.

Although there has been flooding elsewhere in the country we have escaped its worst effects. We have had an average amount of rain from October to January, thus keeping the groundwater level low. It will continue to rise during February, but unless we get

rain of biblical proportions in February and March we won't have any danger of flooding this Winter.
