
COMPTON DAY CENTRE UPDATE. SEPTEMBER 2011

A final report with good news is that later this month the building will be given to Compton Village Hall Management Committee of Trustees. The private care company called Care@Home will continue as they are at present to give professional elderly day care at this centre. Some residents may already have this company as their home day care providers.

I have been told by AgeUK that there was insufficient feedback to ensure sustainability for the proposed Active Retirement Club at the Day Centre. This was in response to our publicity campaign and handouts to Downland local residents who would wish to go to the centre as an alternative if a care provider could not be found. My thoughts on this are that it could have been a combination of a variety of reasons such as there are lunch clubs already active in some

villages, that some thought that was a good idea and wanted to go but didn't contact AgeUK, or that the incorrect cost of attending the club mooted at the time was too expensive. Whatever the reasons I would like to thank all involved in circulating the appeal and the form filling from residents. Last but not least to those who volunteered to help. It was a conundrum that we had enough volunteer's names to run the centre but not enough people to go. This says a lot for the untapped community spirit and the help there is available in our villages.

Update for September Here is the latest update

for the Downlands Area from PCSO C8851 Andrew Whitaker.

The latest crime statistics can be found by visiting www.police.uk, which provides helpful information about crime and policing in your area. It shows the crime figures for your area by entering your location in the search box on the main screen. This allows instant access to street-level crime maps and data, as well as details of the neighbourhood team and providing useful crime prevention advice.

As the new PCSO to the Downlands Area I will take this opportunity to briefly introduce myself. Over the coming months I will be doing my utmost to meet people within the Downlands Community and engage as much as possible. I understand that the area has been without a PCSO over the summer and I am gathering as much information as I can from our team in Thatcham who have been covering the post. I am thoroughly looking forward to the role. I come from a rural background and my attributes make me well equipped for this role.

On the 19th August there was a large theft of diesel at Rowles Farm in West Ilsley between 1.00am and 3.00am. The offenders had stolen 1800 litres of diesel from a secure tank, in which the lock was cut off and the diesel taken. If you heard anything or saw anything suspicious that night please do not hesitate to get in touch on the police non-emergency number – 08458 505505.

Hare coursing has remained an issue throughout the summer and in one incident a Green Land Rover Discovery was seen travelling between West Ilsley and Farnborough on the 19th August. Officers attended and completed an area search of the area but could not find the vehicle or the four males that were identified inside. In a separate incident hare coursers were seen on August 25th on Bury Lane. If you suspect hare coursing is happening call 999 immediately and pass on as many details as possible.

There have been ongoing issues with youths acting anti-socially in the Beedon area. Criminal damage has also been reported in connection to this. Investigations are ongoing to reduce levels of ASB in the area to find who committed the offence. If you are suffering from acts of antisocial behaviour then please report it to the local police, who can work in resolving the problem.

Theft of scrap metal has been reported in various areas across the Downlands. Local policing teams are continuously patrolling the area to find those who are possibly involved. If you see any suspicious vehicles loitering in the area please call our non-emergency helpline on 08458 505505.

Speeding is a priority in the area as set by our local policing team. With that in mind the team have been speed monitoring in various spots. These details will be passed onto the safer roads partnership who will assess the results and look to carry out enforcement operations in the areas that have been identified to be a particular problem.

I will be working hard to promote community messaging and the benefits it has for our community. It is a free service that provides information to subscribers about crime and police activity in their area via phone or email. It also includes information on what we and our partner services are doing to bring offenders to justice or


