## The Dominoes Partnership a week of Film making fun

The Dominoes Partnership is a partnership of 12 schools in the Downlands area working together with external agencies and the community to provide Extended Schools Services which boost job prospects, life experience and well being of children, young people and their families.

A week long film school was held at Chieveley Primary school for a group of 23 children aged 9

- 11 from 9 Schools in the Dominoes Partnership. Everyone who attended got the opportunity to experience the vital roles in the film making process, by taking part in this project the children had the experience of making a low budget film and learned the importance of Teamwork, Leadership, Communication, Commitment and Confidence.

The two films were made entirely by the children from original idea to final cut, they provided the storyboard, costume and set design, acted in, filmed and edited both films.

Thames Valley Traffic Police kindly provided support with filming the final scene of one of the films, when they came along with one of their cars and two PC's – much to the excitement of the children.

The Corn Exchange kindly hosted a preview screening of the films on Sunday  $2^{nd}$  August at 12.00, all the guests who attended had a great time.

Alex Butler, Head teacher at Hampstead Norreys Primary school who attended the screening said "The screening and the summer school were very successful, both Iona and Conner who attended from my school had a great time!"

Lisa Bennett, Extended Services Manager for The Dominoes Partnership, said, "This has been a great week, the children have worked very hard and had a great deal of fun. Well I took the plunge last September and bought my first share in a flat horse (having previously had jumpers) called Queen's Hawk with Denis Coakley at Keeper's Stables and then helped to put together a syndicate of 12 shares, of which most are owned by locals. We have all had immense enjoyment from the whole experience, from seeing him as a yearling at the stables, training on the gallops and progressing into a successful 2 year old racing at some of the best racecourses in the country. Queen's Hawk has taken us to Bath, Goodwood, Newmarket and even Royal Ascot (top hat and tails no less). He did us proud by winning at Goodwood on only his second race; his winning picture is proudly displayed in the Harrow. The thrill and excitement of cheering him home on his first success at Goodwood and being in the winners' enclosure was indescribable for everyone involved and win or lose we generally end up celebrating in the Harrow! Each one of us feels that Queen's Hawk is our own horse. We can visit him at the stables and bring family and friends to see him and meet other owners in a very friendly environment. Denis keeps us up to date on his progress and future race entries.
