Report from the meeting on 18<sup>th</sup> November 2002

In the absence of any volunteers applying to become Parish Councillors, three Local Government Officers from West Berks Council have been appointed to fulfill Parish Council functions. They introduced themselves as: Nick Carter - Corporate Director, Strategy & Commissioning, David Holling — Head of Legal & Electoral Services, Andy Day — Policy Manager of the District Council. Nick Carter was elected as Chairman.

David Holling explained that that the vacancies would continue to be advertised every two months until they were filled. The next notice of vacancies will be posted on <u>Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> January 2003</u>. The cost to the Parish for each uncontested election is £42.35 payable to West Berks Council.

The matter of flooding in the village was discussed at length. The Clerk will again write to West Berks Highways department requesting that the matter be urgently addressed and that in the meantime the drains be kept clear.

There have been several dogs in the village that appear to be suffering with symptoms of poisoning. Would all parishioners be careful with poisons and chemicals ensuring that they are used responsibly and stored securely.

The Mobile Library will be calling at Morland Close on January 14<sup>th</sup>, February 4<sup>th</sup> 25<sup>th</sup>, and March 18<sup>th</sup>.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> January.

#### GENERAL INTEREST

This will be the last magazine entry for 2002. I can't believe it's nearly Christmas already. I would like to end the year by thanking all the editors, who have included these articles each month and for the additional contacts that I have built up as a result.

#### HARE COURSING

I mentioned last month about Hare Coursing and the problems that the coursers create, mainly for the farming Community. A couple of weeks ago we ran a special operation in West Berkshire in conjunction with an op being run in South Oxfordshire. Although we didn't have any arrests on the day I would like to think that we were successful. A couple of groups of suspected coursers were encountered early in the day who were quickly moved on. Word obviously got round that we were out in force because for the rest of the day we had no problems at all. Unfortunately we simply haven't got the money to run these type of operations on a regular basis.

**WILDLIFE** 

On the wildlife theme some of you may be interested and probably upset to hear that we have had bird of prey illegal shootings in the area recently which I am currently investigating. Both Red Kites and Buzzards have been shot which I find almost beyond belief as both species rely almost entirely on carrion (dead things) and very rarely take anything live, unless it is sick or injured. This makes it even more galling when someone takes a gun and shoots one of these spectacular birds out of the sky. Through these pages I would like to make it absolutely clear that I would have no hesitation in securing a prosecution if it could be proved who the offender was and very hefty fines and short prison sentences are now there to be used by the courts. We would also do our utmost to have firearms and shotgun certificates revoked if the circumstances fitted.

#### **RESULTS**

On the above subject we have just charged a male youth with offences surrounding the death of a bird of prey in Hungerford just to support what is said above.

2 males were caught in Chieveley who were responsible for a house burglary that had just occurred. One was charged and the other was cautioned.

A male person from the Hermitage area was arrested for drugs possession.

An adult male from Curridge village was arrested and charged with criminal damage.

We had a serious incident involving someone being slashed with a knife in Hungerford. The offender was initially arrested for attempted murder but later charged with assault.

Unfortunately we had a very serious public order incident in Lambourn a couple of weeks ago when 3 police officers were injured, one of whom received very serious leg injuries which will probably result in him being off work for some considerable time. 3 persons were arrested and charged with a variety of offences including Grievous Bodily Harm.

There have, yet again, been several arrests throughout the area for drink drive related matters.

#### **FINALLY**

I would like to take this opportunity to wish all readers a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!!

<u>BUT</u>, before I go, I will make an appeal to you all! Please do not leave lots of presents under the Christmas tree and then promptly go out for the evening leaving your curtains wide open with your

lights on, showing off the 'loot'. You might find that when you come back from your pleasant evening out that 'Billy burglar' has been at work IN YOUR HOUSE! and there could be tearful children (young and old!!) on Christmas day, with no presents to unwrap.

#### FINALLY, FINALLY

I will shortly be leaving Hungerford for 3 months taking up a post at Newbury Police Station. During that period I will not be in a position to carry on with these articles. However, it's probable, that I shall return after that 3 month period, when I shall, once again, eagerly put pen to paper.
