Alzheimer's fight again dementia Society

The Reading Phoenix Choir, considered one of the finest amateur choirs in the UK, has invited the Willink School to perform with them in a charity concert for the Alzheimer's Society West Berkshire. The Concert will take place on the evening of Saturday 1st March 2008 at St Nicolas Church in Newbury, a popular venue that plays host to many classical concerts throughout the year.

Reading Phoenix Choir is a 50 strong, mixed voice choir, directed by Norman Morris. It has members of all backgrounds and ages, with experience ranging from degrees/diplomas to average sight readers, all sharing a love of choral music. Phoenix does not sing the "works" but explores the whole range of a capella music, early and contemporary, sacred and secular, serious and light. They are prize winners in all the major choral competitions.

The concert aims to involve the local community to raise funds for the West Berkshire branch of the Alzheimer's Society, especially its "Singing for the Brain" programme. The Reading Phoenix Choir have kindly donated their performance in aid of this cause for which some of its members volunteer. Conductor Norman Morris leads two Singing for the Brain groups.

The event will include musical pieces from the Jazz Band and Choir made up of students attending the Willink School in Burghfield Common. Gavin Hurley, the Willink's Head of Creative Arts, has initiated great improvements to the standard of music taught at the school. The School's successful performance of the Little Shop of Horrors and most recently, Grease, revealed enormous talents in the pupils.

Chreanne Montgomery-Smith, Alzheimer's Support and Development worker for West Berkshire, is passionate about the use of singing and its effect on people with dementia and carers. The Singing for the Brain founded by Chreanne has seen amazing benefits in participants and the number of groups running has been steadily increasing over the past few years. "We are so grateful to the Phoenix Choir and to Willink School for donating their time and expertise to us. Raising money through a musical event is incredibly relevant to the work we do; helping people with dementia and their families have an enjoyable and stimulating life through social therapeutic activity."
