
FETE NEWS

NATURE NOTES

10th June

Along the Catmore road a lapwing dive bombs a passing red kite and successfully drives it out of it's breeding territory, I hope that they are as successful in

deterring them when their chicks hatch? Even the RSPB admit that red kite predation is having а negative impact lapwing on populations. At their Otmoor



reserve near Oxford they are providing food for the kites during the period when the lapwing have chicks in the hope that this will divert their attention? I watched this aerial display whilst sitting on an old telegraph pole that has been laid across a gateway to deter hare coursers. My attention is drawn to a small, off white, lady bird with black spots which scuttles along the pole, this is a sixteen spot ladybird. It shares the pole with several black spiders, which are evenly spaced every eighteen inches, these are hunting spiders, each in their own little territory. The ladybird passes within an eighth of an inch of one of the spiders, but there is no reaction, perhaps the spider had tried one before and discovered the distasteful, bitter tasting blood, that is exuded when this tiny beetle is attacked?
