

#### ALL SAINTS CHURCH FINANCES

At a recent PCC meeting it was thought that the people of West Ilsley, who always give so generously at our fund raising events, might like to know how All Saints Church finances are put to use.

In 2007 All Saints outgoings were approximately  $\pounds$ 9,200 which covered chiefly the Parish share, upkeep of the church and a few other general expenses. The Parish Share (in 2007 a sum of  $\pounds$ 7,100) goes towards the income of our clergy. Other church costs of insurance, lighting, organist etc. came to approximately  $\pounds$ 2,100 in the same year. This year, we have received a grant from the WI Trust towards that insurance.

It may come as a surprise that despite being part of an established state church, we receive no state funding apart from Gift Aid returns, nor from the national church. We are entirely dependent on local giving.

Income was generated primarily from collections in church, donations and fund raising, as is always the case. Most of this income was unplanned, apart from the sum of £1,360 from Gift Aided standing orders, some of which were set up some years ago. Taking the outgoings of £9,200 in 2007, we had to find an average of nearly £770 a month. As our average receipts from planned giving were only £113 a month, we had to find over £650 a month from other unspecified sources. This imposes a huge reliance on fund raising. As no one can predict the success of a fund raising event, we are always in rather a precarious position financially. We all know that cost of living prices seem to be rising strongly lately, and unfortunately your Church has not been insulated from these, particularly in respect to insurance, electricity etc. We are continuously grateful to all who give so generously to All Saints, but as a small congregation we still have to find considerable funds.

So, to those already giving, would you be able to review your standing order amount to help meet today's costs? For those who might like to donate by standing order, and every little helps, a Gift Aid form will need to be filled in. Please phone Kay Fewtrell-Smith on 281625 for a form.
