PARISH COUNCIL

The white lines in the middle of West Ilsley's roads - including Main Street - will soon be a thing of the past. West Berks Council has decided to let them "fade naturally" on the grounds that doing so has been shown to cut traffic speeds. The council's action (if you can call not repainting white lines "action") is one of a series of measures designed to make our roads a little bit safer. The bend by Morland Close, where there have been a couple of smashes into the wall of Manor Cottage, will be highlighted and the markings at the edge of the layby improved. There'll also be improvements in the coming weeks to the 30mph and "slow" signs on the approaches to the village. All this follows energetic work by Cllr John Mountford on the subject of speeding and the support of George Chandler on the district council.

parish November's council meeting, unanimous view was that more needs to be done. We've now written to ask for the 30mph sign on the East Ilsley road to be moved further up the hill so that drivers have a chance to slow down before they reach the village rather than when they're already in it. We've also called for a white gateway on the road from East IIsley to give motorists more warning that they're coming into West IIsley. We want the road markings at the bottom of Bury Lane to be repainted so that nobody coming down that hill is in any doubt that they're about to hit a T-junction. And what about the A34 exit for East and West Ilsley? Is there anyone who hasn't had a near miss as they leave the A34 with cars from East IIsley swinging towards them on their way to join the dual carriageway? We've asked repeatedly for this to be addressed, but so far in vain. The fear is that West Berks won't come up with the cash to put this right unless the danger is proved by a serious accident.

POSTCARD FROM GUERNSEY

I meant to write months back and just give everyone a peephole view of life on this very pretty maritime island. The first five months have disappeared in that vapour which is life. I cannot believe some 150-odd days have disappeared since my arrival - each one spent happily and to the full. At the risk of boring everyone (especially those who saw THAT episode of Island Hospital on ITV..), I thought you could hear it from the horse's mouth.

Firstly, I must say that I thought I would find life away from West Ilsley, after living here for 30 years, very difficult. You cannot replace very good friends, earned over these years: good friends are hard to find and I loved where I lived. West Ilsley is a very special community, as those who live in it well know (that is why we all play Musical Houses when someone moves!!). So, it was with some trepidation that I moved.

I wasn't prepared for the warmth of Guernsey people, the ease and accessibility around the island, the unlocked doors and the amazing outdoor lifestyle. I did spend the first four weeks getting hopelessly lost all the time. I travelled 90 miles in the first month - 70 miles of which were totally unnecessary! One night, travelling some three miles back from The Boss's house I got bewildered and befuddled - it took an hour and five minutes to do what should have taken five. Without Sat Nav, there were too many small lanes, too few landmarks, too many turns, nowhere to reverse....Thankfully, I arrived in the summer when the days were long and most of the time I could read the map and discover some of the local Ruettes Tranquilles (Guernsey Patois) the small, narrow lanes. I didn't visit a petrol station for six weeks! An immediate cost saving of £60 a week on fuel. It is peculiar not to travel miles to a supermarket: I can "pop" to a store. Waitrose seems to be no different here - except there is more french wine on the shelves at lower prices.

I walk and cycle to work - I have to. The dairy products here are so yummy I need the exercise. Very shortly, I shall have to revert to type and buy semi-skimmed milk, otherwise it will be death by dairy product: the full fat stuff is so good on cereal and in coffee. I do love going past The Girls (cows... larger and not as picture-book pretty as their Jersey counterparts, rather more Catherine Zeta-Jones than Cheryl Cole, shall we say?). In the morning and evening, they are munching away in the fields, even now - November!!

Full-time work after 20-something years part-time was not as much of a shock as I had anticipated. The camaraderie and cohesion of the team is great and the work ethic is big. This is

compensation in a small way for leaving my work colleagues and friends behind. I did have a small wobble when I came back for a week's holiday, but fortunately firmed up quickly once I was back on the island again. Keeping busy is good, if not hard.

So here comes Christmas. It will be lovely to be home again, but I am sure that Christmas next year in Guernsey will be fine. I am hoping to catch up with lots of old friends over the Christmas and New Year period and appreciate all the kind words and thoughts extended to me this year! Lots of Love and hugga-mugga to everyone.

FAREWELL TO ARMS.

Most of you are aware of my impending retirement but it looks as though I shall be departing after Christmas. The time line is somewhat vague, as with most things, because of external confirmation. Anyway based on the premise that it will happen I would just like to take the opportunity to say how much I have enjoyed being your postman over the years and though my replacement has as yet to be appointed I am sure life will go on.


