Roger Deakin in his book Wildwood describes these buds as "like the black snout of a badger", to me they resemble the black hooves of a roe deer, complete with flanking dewclaws. The winter gallops side of The Furze is bright with yellow gorse flowers and of course it is the gorse, or furze as it is also known, that has produced the vernacular name "The Fuzz" for this spinney. There is a saying "That when the gorse is out of bloom, kissing is out of season". Fortunately the gorse flowers in every month.



The ground water level has risen about 3.5 metres (11.5ft) during February and at the end of the month it is approximately 13 metres (42.6ft) below ground level. From this we can safely assume that the River Pang will stay safely below ground in West Ilsley this Winter.

FEBRUARY'S FARMING NEWS

It would now appear that dry cold weather is approaching. This will mean that we will be able to start work in the fields spraying, fertilising and possibly cultivating before planting the Spring Barley crop and now is an ideal time for planting and preferably before the end of March to give the crops the best chance of producing a good yield.

The ewes at Folly Farm are very close to lambing and, unfortunately, a few ewes have aborted their lambs. This does often happen, but let us hope this will stop shortly and live lambs will soon be born.

We have recently had a TB test and were extremely fortunate to have no reactors and so, therefore, all the animals have passed.

Hopefully some nice warm spring sunshine will help everything along. Peter Carlisle

NEWS FROM THE DOWNLAND PRACTICE


