COUNTRY NOTES

Those of you who attended the talk on owls in the village hall in March may remember that I said that the population of Little Owls in the UK is declining, a 78% decrease between 1967–2020. There are only 3,600 breeding pairs compared to 50,000 Tawny Owls.

It is thought that changes in agricultural practices may have reduced the availability of their favoured invertebrate prey. It is also likely that a reduction in potential nest sites is a factor, they like holes in old trees.

At the end of the talk someone asked, "what can we do to help?" Subsequently a few of us decided that



the introduction of suitable nest boxes might help. I'm pleased to say that the first box, made by Jonny Rayfield, was placed on a sycamore tree in the Old Rectory paddock in June. Two more boxes are under construction and will be situated in appropriate sites in July.

The hope is that if there are any breeding Little Owls in the adjacent area that the young birds will leave their parents territories and search for potential new homes. **Geoff Wond**


